

### Poster Push For Handicap Week Drive

A county-wide high school poster contest as part of the supplementary observance of National Employ the physically handicapped Week is being sponsored by the Klamath Falls 20-30 club.

The observance will take place the week of October 2 to 8 nationally and this city will join in the program. The mayor will officially make a proclamation just prior to October 2.

High school students throughout the county are asked to use any idea in creating a graphic picture on any size poster and submit the poster to the Oregon state employment service office, 3rd and Main.

All posters will be displayed in Hears Horbuck company windows. Valuable prizes will be awarded to first, second and third place winners.

This will be the fifth annual observance of such a program, set aside by the 79th congress in 1945.

Several committees and service clubs are working together on the local program.

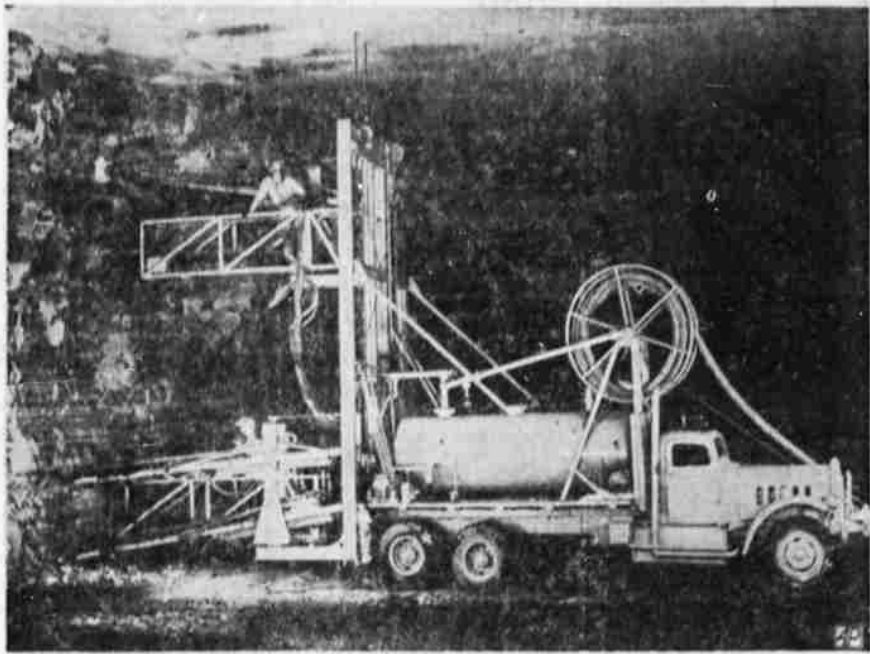

### Archivist Readies History Of Pioneer State Families

SALEM, Sept. 21.—A valuable historical record, containing the names of every family living in Oregon in 1850, is being prepared by David Dunway, state archivist.

It is being compiled from federal census records. The population of Oregon was 12,294 at that time, and was concentrated in the Willamette valley and on the coast.

Dunway said 2000 copies of the book would be published. When it is finished, he will prepare a similar book for 1890, when the population of the state was 217,704.

He said he has run into some

tough problems. The worst is the fact that the 1850 census takers wrote down the family names by ear, instead of having the family heads write them down.

This resulted in some weird spellings. For instance, the pioneer Marion county Abat family was spelled Apps in the census. And the spellings given to French-Canadian names are something to behold, Dunway said.

Dunway said the book would be of great value to historians and to persons who want to trace their families. Every family head will be indexed, both by sound and by spelling.

### Benson Back In Prison

SPOKANE, Sept. 21.—William Benson, who led authorities on a two-day fruitless search for a grave he said held the body of an escaped murderer, was returned last night to the Oregon state penitentiary.

Benson was brought here Sunday from Columbus, Ohio, where he was captured two weeks ago. He escaped from the Salem prison May 25 with John P. Pinson, convicted Hood River.

Benson told authorities Pinson was shot in the escape and that he had buried him. But he couldn't find the grave.

The officials, meanwhile, stood pat on their belief that Pinson actually is alive and is the same man now being sought for an armed robbery in Idaho under the name of Joseph Anthony Dorian. A picture of Dorian has been identified "positively" as that of Pinson, detectives said.
