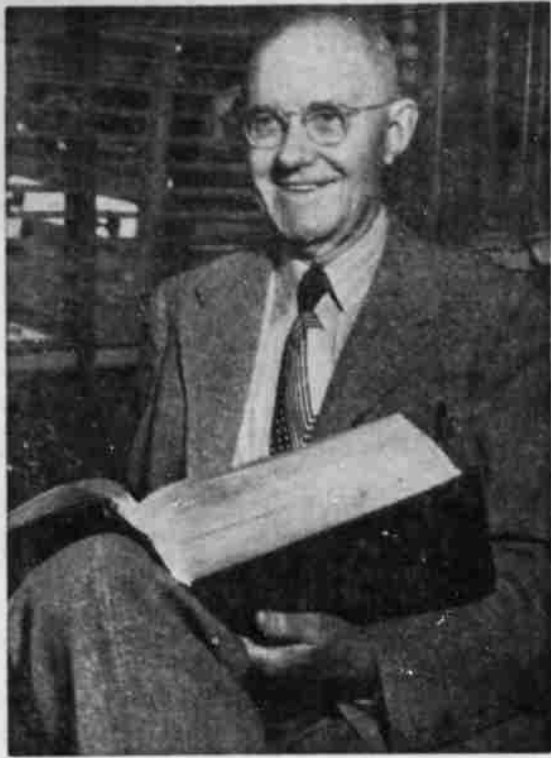


Elks Lodge Honors Bert Hall

Ethiopians Worry About Earth Holes

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia (AP)—Since the world is flat, the Sinclair Petroleum company had better take care that its drills don't burst through the other side and let all the oil leak out. And anyway, how can oil have been formed millions of years ago when the present year is only 1949?

Those are typical remarks of back country Ethiopians to Rene J. SEVERENCE, N. Y., Sept. 21 (AP)—The Rev. John Francis Bobbs, president emeritus of Pacific University at Forest Grove, Ore., died yesterday at his summer home here. He was 79.

He had served as pastor of the Dutch Reformed church at Syracuse, Mount Haven Reformed church in the Bronx and the First Congregational church at Malden, Mass., before becoming president of the university. He retired in 1940. He was a native of Pine Brook, N. J.

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 21 (AP)—Dr. William Ernest Hinds, 44, succumbed to polio yesterday while his eight-year-old son lay stricken with the disease in the same hospital. The boy was reported improving.

Before coming here two years ago he had practiced for 12 years in Hillsboro, Ore. He was a past president of the Oregon State Osteopathic society and a founder of the Portland Osteopathic hospital. His widow and three sons survive.
