Syria Takes Look At Itself

DAMASCUS (AP)—For the first time this little Levantine country, which has sent many immigrants to the United States and South America, has been able to take a long look at itself in a statistical mirror. A new government agency has produced what are believed to be the first wholly accurate and modern statistics on the country.

It reported Syria has a present population of 3,043,310. The country is 227½ kilometers long. Its borders

include 173 kilometers of seacoast, 808 kilometers fronting Turkey, 592 bordering Iraq, 353 with Hashemite Jordan and 70 kilometers with Israel.

There are 1072 elementary schools—only 194 of them for girls. Elementary school students numbered 187,256. The 84 secondary schools had 18,914 students. The country has nine professional schools and one university, with 1728 university students.
