

Vet's Mail Bag

As a service to veterans in the community, this newspaper will publish an occasional column of news items from the veterans administration. For further information veterans should contact or write their nearest VA office.

Veterans now may take flight training under the GI bill without necessarily submitting to veterans administration complete justification that the course will be taken in connection with their present or contemplated business or occupation.

Instead of complete justification, a veteran planning to take GI flight training now may submit to VA (1) a certificate in the form of an affidavit signed by him, and (2) corroborating affidavits by two competent disinterested persons. The affidavits must show that flight training will be useful to him in connection with earning a livelihood.

In the absence of substantial evidence to the contrary, VA will accept the affidavits as constituting compliance with the law.

Must Prove Fitness
Along with affidavits, the veteran also must submit a certificate showing that he is physically qualified for flight training, in accordance with civil aeronautics administration standards, to obtain the type of license that will enable him to attain his employment objective.

"Competent disinterested persons," VA explained, means those qualified by reason of their personal knowledge of facts and circumstances to testify concerning the veteran's use of flight training in connection with earning a livelihood.

Such persons also are to have "no interest whatsoever, either personal or by association, in the pursuit or non-pursuit by the veteran of the desired course of flight training," VA said.

Affidavits by members of a veteran's family, or by owners or employees of flight schools do not constitute evidence of disinterested persons.

Necessary Points
The corroborating affidavits must establish clearly and definitely the following points:

1. Identity of the applicant for GI bill flight training.
2. The character of the relationship between the veteran and the person supplying the affidavit.
3. The basis and source of asserted knowledge of the matters to which the person supplying the affidavit is testifying.

VA said that veterans desiring flight training under the GI bill may, if they wish, submit complete justification that the training would be in connection with their present or contemplated business or occupation—rather than submit affidavits authorized by the new law.

Other Studies
If a veteran wants to train in any course which is frequently pursued for avocational or recreational purposes (with the exception of flight

training), he must continue to submit to the VA regional office complete justification that the course he wants is in connection with his present or contemplated business or occupation.

Prior approval of the regional office must be obtained before such training may be started.

When the justification that the veteran submits is not adequate to justify the training desired, he will be notified that he may request advice and guidance before a final determination is made.

In the latter case, the opinion of the VA vocational adviser as to whether the course is in connection with the present or contemplated business or occupation of the veteran will be acceptable evidence for determining the case.

ROME (AP)—Scientists have discovered the ruins of a Roman town in a lagoon on the North Adriatic sea. A group headed by Mario Fontani, an authority on Roman and early medieval archeology, may have found the ruins of a legendary town, reportedly sunk in the lagoon shallow waters, during the first centuries of our era.

When the Huns headed by King Attila swept across the Alps to the Italian plains, the population of the town will be acceptable evidence for determining the case.

Fake Lost Son Returns Twice

BERLIN (AP)—A mother and daughter in Berlin welcomed home their lost son and brother in November 1945. They thought he looked strange, but they remembered he had fought through the war and been a prisoner of the allies.
