Wellman Smith, owner of the Moonlight mine just south of the state line, said that the tremor cracked a huge rock in the tunnel of his mine and caused a cup and saucer to fall to the floor and break in his cabin.

## Lake County Gets \$139,695 As National Forest Share

Lake county will receive \$139,695 as its share of the 25 per cent of the national forest receipts which are distributed to the counties in Oregon for fiscal year 1946, according to an estimate prepared by the forest service. This will be over \$6000 more than the county received last year from this source.

Lake county is the fifth highest county in Oregon in the amount received from national forest receipts. It is exceeded only by Lane, Douglas, Linn, and Klamath counties in that order.

This money is derived from 25 per cent of the receipts received by the national forest during any fiscal year from timber sales, grazing fees, special use fees and other revenue.

These payments are in lieu of taxes and are made each year by the

federal government through the state to counties having national forests within their boundaries.

This money is provided for road and school purposes, and the receipt from any forest are divided among the counties in proportion to that part of the forest within the county's boundary.

These funds will probably not be received by the county until some time during the winter but will be available for expenditure during the present fiscal year.

It is expected that the amount received this year will be the peak received for several years because of the high price for stumpage received during fiscal year 1949, according to Forest Supervisor Merle S. Lowden.

Because of the reduced stumpage rate and the less cutting being done currently on the national forest, it is expected that 25 per cent returns to the county may be considerably lower next year.

It is expected that all counties within the state of Oregon will receive \$2,646,846.68 from this source during the current year. An additional 10 per cent of national forest receipts is made available to the forest service for the construction and maintenance of forest roads and trails.

While next year's receipts are ex-

pected to be lower, under sustained yield management it is estimated Lake county's returns will continue to be high.

## Lake Business Census Taken

LAKEVIEW, Sept. 23—The federal business census in Lake county has been completed and final reports will be in Washington by the end of this month, it was announced here today by Mrs. Gertrude M. Arnold, Bend district supervisor of the census.

Mrs. Arnold said that Lake county was the first of her eight counties to complete its census. In the entire county, she and her assistants had to return to only three firms for additional information.
