State Farmers Get \$335,000 Federal Fund

PORTLAND, Sept. 23 (AP)—Oregon farmers will get \$335,000 more next year in the federal conservation program.

That will boost the total for the year to \$2,479,000, the state production and marketing committee said yesterday.

Clackamas and Wasco counties may become test grounds for a new conservation plan. Instead of treating each year as an isolated unit, the new plan would set up a permanent improvement program for a farm.
