New Wheat Rated 'Only Fair'

PORTLAND, Sept. 30 (AP) — The new wheat developed at the Oregon State college experimental station at Pendleton may not be released for general use.

The wheat, called "uma," was rated only fair in cake and cookie baking tests by the Pacific Northwest Crop Improvement association. Two wheats developed at Washington State college were given good to very good ratings.

The association's executive committee recommended that "uma" not be released for use until it has been developed further. The OSC experiment station is still considering the question.
