Since the old frame church burned to the ground last January services have been held in the recreation hall.

### Oregon Tech Out-of-State Tuition Cut

A \$15 reduction in tuition fees for out-of-state students atregon Tech was voted by the state board of education in Salem. OTI Director Winston D. Purvine has just returned from last week's meeting.

The reduction is from \$25 to \$10 per term. In addition, the board confirmed the appointment of Robert Burk of Port Angeles, Wash. as dry cleaning instructor and Paul Feikel, auto mechanics instructor, of Klamath Falls.

Howard Appointed Appointment of John Howard as curriculum supervisor was confirmed. The position is a trial post for the job of supervisor of instruction at OTI which is now open. Three grades and base salary scales were set for supervisors of the school.

The board's approval was given to establishment of a 10-watt, FM educational broadcasting license for a radio station at Oregon Tech. Necessary equipment is now on hand and everything is ready to start pending FCC approval. Purvine said he anticipates that the station will be on the air in mid-November.
