Car, Train Hit; 2 Killed

MOUNT VERNON, Wash., Oct. 3 (AP)—Two prominent Skagit county men were killed instantly yesterday evening and their wives critically injured when their car collided with a Seattle City Light company train a mile west of Marblemount.

The dead are Fred H. Snyder, Anaerotes druggist, and Wendell R. Whitney, pioneer La Conner business man. Mrs. Whitney and Mrs. Snyder are both in the Sedro-Woolley Memorial hospital.

Striking the left side of the 1946 sedan driven by Snyder, the gasoline-powered train carried the car nearly 60 feet beyond the grade crossing.

State Prison Escapee Held

CANYON CITY, Ore., Oct. 3 (AP)—Convict Leo Gilbert Williams, who escaped the state prison September 22 with two other men, was held in the Grant county jail here today.

He was captured in this area Saturday night after an alert logging camp superintendent noticed a truck was in the wrong place.

Emory Moore, superintendent of the Heppner Logging company, spotted a company truck—normally used only on logging camp property—at the town of Montz.

He called state police, saying the truck must have been stolen. Police arrested Williams.

Williams broke out of the jail through a dry flume with William John Perkins, who is still free, and young Earl Raiback, who was captured shortly after the break.

Tractor-Held Boy Drawn in Slough

PORTLAND, Oct. 3 (AP)—A teenage boy drowned in a few feet of water in a slough yesterday when his tractor underneath an overturned tractor.

Police said Angelo Fazio was operating the tractor near his North-east Portland home. A younger

cousin was thrown clear of the machine. The father, Tony Fazio, a Sauvie Island truck farm operator, witnessed the mishap and with passersby dug the boy from under the tractor.
