# Irish Win But Leahy Explodes

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Oct. 3 (AP)—Who got hurt the most in that Washington-Notre Dame football tussle Saturday—the Huskies or Coach Frank Leahy?

Four Washington backs and a lineman got damaged as Notre Dame belatedly turned on its steam at Seattle and rushed to a 27-7 victory.

But Leahy's feelings were hurt. He put in a big blast on the officiating and asserted "we had to play four extra men."

Notre Dame lost 135 yards in penalties in the contest, while Washington was set back 20.

Leahy sounded off immediately after the game. He still hadn't cooled off by the time he reached Chicago last night. He repeated his charges:

"The officials did their best to protect coast conference football," he declares angrily, adding he was "tired of accepting incompetence politely and without comment."

Howie Odell, coach of the Huskies, was taken somewhat aback by all this. He said in Seattle he was "surprised and disappointed that Mr. Leahy would make such a statement. They're all good football officials."

Leahy was plenty bitter about the whole thing.

"The officials today—all four of them—tried their best to even up a football game. And that goes!" he said after the game. "They wouldn't even explain the penalties they called to our captain."

"Not a one of them, none of the four, ever will officiate another game for Notre Dame as long as I am associated with the school."

The officials were Referee Thomas D. Wilson, from College of the Pacific; Umpire William Corbus, Stanford; Head Linesman W. H. Frazer, Gonzaga, and Field Judge Elwood T. Starbuck, Chicago.

Leahy also had charged that the officials had refused to explain the penalties to Notre Dame Captain Leon Hart.

"That is false," Wilson replied. "We explained every penalty as it arose."

Notre Dame polished off Washington, 27-7.

Minnesota entertains Northwestern in one of the Midwest's major frays. Minnesota sank Nebraska, 28-6, last week, while Pittsburgh scored the day's major upset by knocking off Northwestern's Rose Bowl champs, 16-7.

In the deep South, Tulane rolled over Georgia Tech, 18-0.

North Carolina took a 21-14 verdict over Georgia.

In the Southwest, Southern Methodist remained among the unbeaten by outlasting Missouri, 28-27.

# Bobby Riggs Couldn't Beat 'em, So He'll Run 'em

NEW YORK (NEA)—Robert Riggs had to overcome the psychological disadvantage of the small athlete to scale the heights.

And when Bobby Riggs could no longer handle Jack Kramer's second serve on their tour, the Little Man Who Walks Like a Duck had the answer for that one too. If Riggs couldn't beat 'em, he'd run 'em.

So Riggs supplants Jack Harris as the No. 1 professional tennis pro-motor.

He came out of his long road show with Kramer with \$100,000 after taxes, and is investing \$60,000 in Pancho Gonzales.

Gonzales—six feet two, 180 pounds—won the national singles at 20 on his second eastern swing, a remarkable feat, and repeated this summer in a dramatic comeback against Ted Schroeder. Tennis players improve from 20 to 24 or 25. William T. Tilden II, for example, wasn't champion until he was 27.

Making Gonzales' rapid rise all the more extraordinary is the fact that he was for some time denied the privilege of competition because he was a bad boy.

Young Gonzales is reminiscent of a black panther, and like that jungle baby is likely to strike at any moment. He was just born that way, would have stuck out in any game. It just so happens that his mother handed him a racket that cost her 51 cents to keep him off the streets and out of trouble when he was 14.

Gonzales' serve is the best since that of Ellsworth Vines, and an opponent couldn't live on the court with the Pasadena stringbean when he was on his game. Gonzales' overhead is magnificent, practically the same stroke, of course. His ground strokes are adequate.

If an opponent can't break Gonzales' serve, he might as well pack up. The same is true of Jack Kramer.

Two big serves. One service break means the set.

There won't be any lost motion, and Bobby Riggs has them ready on the firing line.
