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23 Years Ago

Monday, October 4, 1926—The time is not far when pelicans will bid their adieu to Klamath. Yesterday on Agency lake and on Klamath lake great conclaves of the stately birds assembled—the preliminary to the southward flight.

Tuesday, October 5, 1926—One of the biggest individual yields of grain on record in the Klamath basin has been harvested from Tule lake this year on the Cox brothers' leased land, according to word received here today. The Merrill ranchers have harvested 50,000 bushels of wheat and 12,000 sacks of barley from the Tule lake leased land.

Wednesday, October 6, 1926—Purchase of approximately two hundred million feet of virgin pine timber north of Bonanza by the Pelican Bay Lumber company from Day Brothers and the Hovey interests became known from authentic sources today. Price of the huge tract is not known but figuring at the conservative estimate of \$6 a thousand, the big deal involved \$1,200,000.

Thursday, October 7, 1926—Consuming flames brought to a tragic check one of Klamath's newest and greatest industries with the burning of the huge barn on the Edgewood ranch in the Swan Lake region, resulting in the incineration of 70 horses and loss of more than \$75,000, according to word brought here today by James Coyne and Captain S. S. Fish.

Friday, October 8, 1926—Fire which verged on a conflagration wiped out fourteen business establishments of Chilquien early this morning, and for a time threatened the destruction of the entire town. Loss was placed at \$65,000, of which more than 50 per cent was covered by insurance.

Saturday, October 9, 1926—YANKEE STADIUM, New York (AP)—The St. Louis Cardinals defeated the New York Yankees, ten to two, here today in the sixth game of the world series, tying the series at three games each and necessitating a seventh game here tomorrow.

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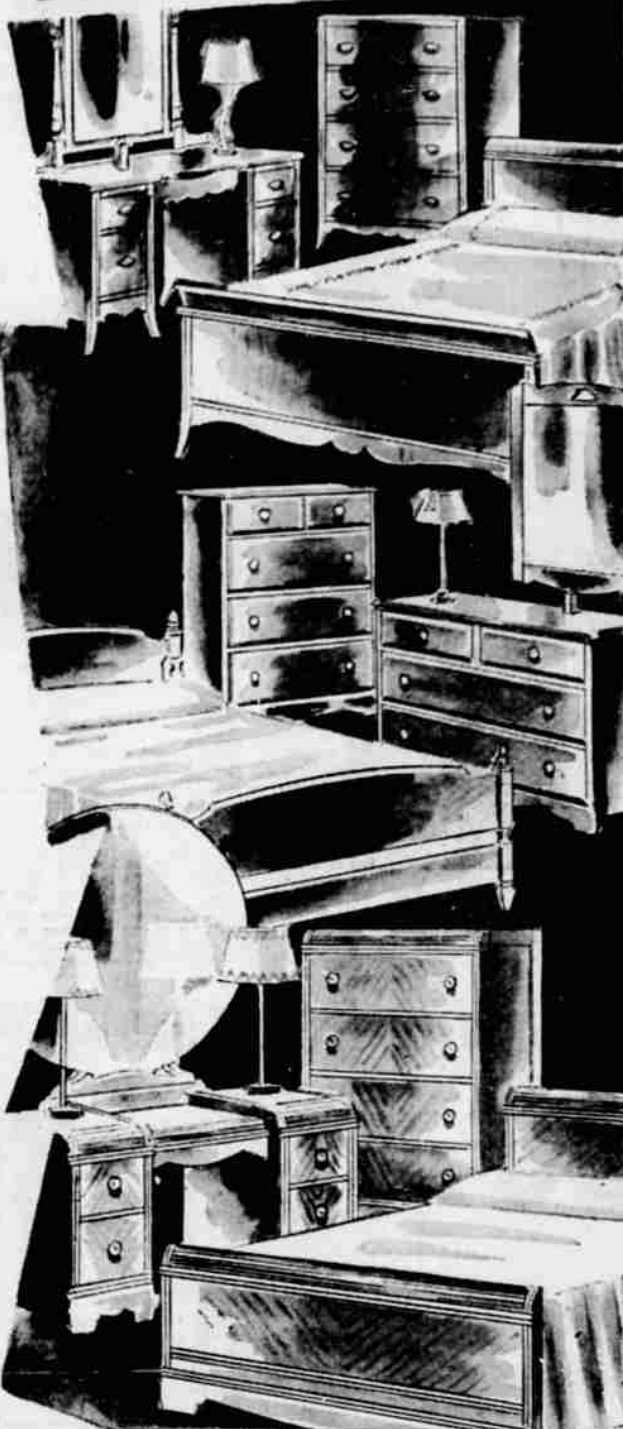
