San Diego had a five run fifth inning last night that drove the Stars' ace Pinky Woods to the showers.

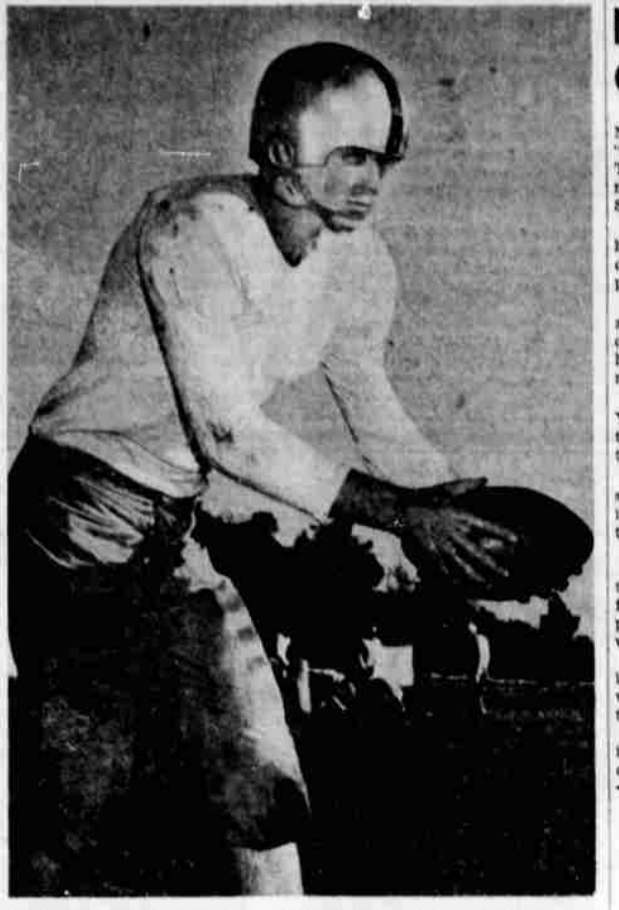

Col. Winn Passes Mr 'Kentucky Derby' Dies After Illness

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 6 (AP)—Mr. "Kentucky Derby" — 88-year-old Col. Matt J. Winn — died here early today.

Winn took over Louisville's historic race track, Churchill Downs, in 1902. Winn and associates organized the American Turf association in opposition to the old Western Turf association in 1904.

Col. Winn was one of the few persons who had seen all 75 of the Kentucky derbies. He saw the first one as a boy of 13 and last May he achieved his life's ambition when he attended the diamond jubilee of the derby.

NEWCOMBE SAYS CIRCUIT OFFERING A LOW CURVE

NEW YORK, Oct. 6 (AP)—Don Newcombe insists that wasn't a "fat" 2-0 pitch he served up to Tommy Henrich in the ninth inning of yesterday's opening World Series game.

"It was a low curve," Brooklyn's huge Negro righthander said in the dressing room later. "It was a good pitch. He just hit it, that's all."

Whatever it was, Henrich took a keen liking to the offering. He caught it on the plump part of his bat and nailed it into the lower rightfield stands.

"I watched it all the way," until Henrich's booming blast that shook 66,224 enthralled patrons from their seats it was a duel of pitching masters such as few previous series afforded.

"If that one pitch had been high instead of low," moaned Brooklyn's white-haired tactician, Bert Shotton, "we'd be out there yet."

Jim Turner, the one-time pitching milkman who now is a Yankee coach, said Reynolds hardly made

a bad pitch all afternoon in carrying his two-hit shutout.

"There was only one well hit ball and that was the 3-and-2 pitch which Jackie Robinson made DiMaggio run for in the sixth," Turner said.

Shotton called Joe DiMaggio's stab of Robinson's screaming blow Brooklyn's "toughest break."

Except for a perfect fielding play it would have meant a certain run. It would have been a home run in Brooklyn's Ebbets Field.

"Nobody in the National league ever plays me that deep," Robinson moaned.

Robinson put in a beef about Cal Hubbard's umpiring behind the plate.

"I've never seen such strikes called," complained the Brooklyn second baseman. "Why, he actually called a pitchout a strike."

The Yankee who seemed to get the greatest satisfaction from Reynolds' triumph was relief Joe Page, who has been called in to rescue the righthander in 20 of his 31 starts this year.

While the throng kept waiting for Reynolds to weaken, as he'd done in every previous start except four, Page just sat in the bullpen and watched admiringly.
