

Bureau Hears Inspection Setup Talk

A large group of Klamath county farm bureau members, meeting at the Wisema hotel Monday evening heard Frank McKennon, Oregon department of agriculture, speak on potato inspections as required by law and carried out in Oregon.

McKennon explained that the grading and inspection of all potatoes moving in ton lots has been compulsory since 1929. He pointed out that an increase in inspection fees since 1941, set by the state department, has been necessary to cover increased expense of the inspection service due to cost-of-living increases in salaries based on a civil service schedule, establishment of a retirement fund on a matching state and federal basis, and increased overhead.

Good Inspectors

He stressed the need for employment of capable efficient inspectors as a safeguard to potato growers.

Twenty to 25 men are maintained on a year-round basis, with 80 to 90 inspectors employed during peak inspection periods. He further stated that a reserve fund was built up during the past year both through check loading inspection service and inspection of all government purchases, but went on to emphasize that this reserve should be maintained to take care of short potato crop years such as 1947-1948, when inspection fees could not cover cost of operating the service.

Uniform Fees

Inspection fees are uniform throughout the state and although onions, filberts, and walnuts are also under compulsory inspection, no money derived from potato inspection is used for these other commodities.

Rose Aubrey, inspector for state and federal shipping point inspection service, who was introduced by Frank W. Brown, president of the Klamath county farm bureau, explained problems which occasionally arise during peak potato shipping periods.

The members were also cautioned to be on the lookout for Newcastle disease since this serious poultry disease, which is easily transmitted, has been reported in several Klamath basin flocks.

The county secretary, Mrs. Elsa Rueck, reported that the membership goal for the year has been exceeded.

Dressed Meat Market Holds

The dressed meat market has held up well in the face of the rising meat supply. The wholesale market for dressed pork has been pretty steady during most of September. Up to a year ago at this time consumers had been spending a higher than usual share of their incomes for meat. Then in the fall they began to shift away from meat. It took lower prices to get them to buy the meat available in the nation's meat markets. The share of the consumer's dollar which went for meat dropped below normal during the first part of 1949. This accounted for at least part of the weaker livestock prices at that time.

Then along toward the middle of the year the trend changed again. The relation of spending for meat compared with total spendable income worked back up to normal again. Consumers were spending about the normal share of their incomes for meat. This is one of the reasons why livestock prices have been strong in late summer compared with the spring months.
