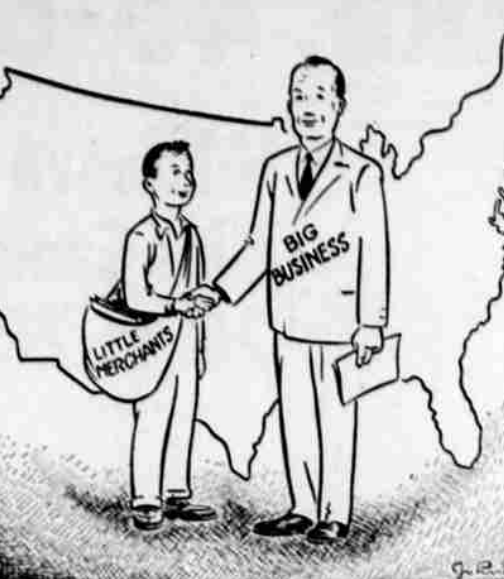

Cheap Sales Boost Stocks

NEW YORK, Oct. 8 (AP)—Demand for low-priced shares helped to prop today's stock market.

Profit-taking sales bit into some recently popular issues and on the whole the market showed a thorough mixture of gains and losses.

A fair amount of business was done for a Saturday although the ticker tape came to a full stop more than once. Turnover was at the rate of around 600,000 shares for the two-hour session.

Callahan Zinc and American Zinc were among the most active issues, both up around 1/2 points. Callahan closed Friday at 1 1/2 and American at 6.

Among the steadier spots were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem Steel, Willys-Overland, Hudson Motors, Good year, Montgomery Ward, Douglas Aircraft, Admiral, American Telephone, Western Union, United Gas, American Smelting, Santa Fe, Standard Oil (N.J.), Superior Oil of California, and RKO.
