**ANSWER:**  
First call in your insurance agent for an appraisal of the house, then make a complete inventory of your furnishings and personal effects. Be very thorough. You'll find the job won't take as long or be as arduous as you think. That inventory and the insurance policy, after it has been issued, should, if possible, be kept in a safe or "strong" box. Then, if you ever have a fire, you can check against the inventory and determine your exact loss.
