More Park Meter Receipts, Goal

PORTLAND, Oct. 10 (AP)—Portland hopes to double its parking meter revenue from its new meters.

About 1000 have been installed. Tests so far indicate the average daily take is 85 cents compared with 25 cents on the old type.

The new ones cost 5 cents per half-hour, but up to four nickels can be put in at the same time. The old meters cost 5 cents an hour, but took only one nickel at a time.
