

Rails, Motors Lead Upswing

NEW YORK, Oct. 11 (AP)—Rails and motors led the stock market into new high ground for the year today in active trading.

Gains were from fractions to around 2 points.

The volume of business was at the rate of about 1,500,000 shares for the entire session, one of the best days in the past month.

A number of new high prices for the year were chalked up by leaders including General Motors, Studebaker, Northern Pacific, Lion Oil, Allied Chemical, and Westinghouse.

The market set a new 1949 high on Thursday, dropped back a little the next day but regained the top position in the short session Saturday. It held that same spot Monday, and then moved on higher today.

Other stocks going higher included U. S. Steel, Youngstown Sheet & Tube, Chrysler, Santa Fe, Goodrich, Phelps Dodge, Home-Stock Mining, Douglas Aircraft, Dow Chemical, General Electric and American Woolen.

WHEAT CORN EASE DOWN

CHICAGO, Oct. 11 (AP)—Wheat eased toward the close of today's board of trade session, and corn dipped below the previous close, but soybeans and lard pushed upward.

The easiness of corn was attributed to a lower east grain market. There was some profit cashing in wheat.

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AFL Shuns Wedding With CIO

ST. PAUL, Minn., Oct. 11 (AP)—Possibility of a political alliance between the AFL and CIO apparently was wiped out today—at least for the time being—by the former's decision to go its own way.

Delegates to the American Federation of Labor convention voted at the closing session last night against making any formal alliance with the CIO or any labor and farm groups.

William Green, 76-year-old president, was re-elected to his 26th straight term.

Separate Action

By unanimous vote the convention adopted a substitute proposal—backed by the organization's top officers—specifically calling for separate AFL political action.

Last year the AFL voted to invite John L. Lewis and his United Mine Workers to return to the AFL fold. At present, however, there seems no disposition on the part of AFL leaders to woo Lewis.

This won't mean local AFL and CIO groups will stop working together. For instance, Philip H. Harnish, a leader of the AFL's Ohio state federation, told reporters all major labor organizations in his state are cooperating in an effort to defeat Sen. Taft (R-Ohio) next fall.

Machinists Eyed

The AFL also expects to make a new effort to get back the now-independent machinists union, which claims more than 600,000 members.

The only criticism of AFL leadership developing at the convention came from Woodruff Randolph, president of the International Typographical union. In a speech at last night's final session, he complained of a lack of AFL sympathy and moral help in the printers union's legal tussle under the Taft-Hartley act.

Nobody replied to Randolph.

The convention endorsed most of the Truman administration's legislative program but suggested a \$1 hourly minimum wage instead of the 75 cent minimum now being pushed in congress to replace the present 40 cent floor.

Murder, Brutality Charges Against Hospital Are Denied

SALEM, Oct. 11 (AP)—The state board of control declared untrue today charges made last week of murder and brutality at the Oregon State Hospital.

The charges, made by the Citizens Action committee of Portland, dealt with incidents which occurred more than five years ago, the board said.

The board also denied charges of insufficient food, and that patients get cold at night.

Incidents

The investigation, made by William C. Ryan, supervisor of institutions, dealt with these incidents:

1. That Jim Butler, a patient, was murdered in June, 1942, by an attendant who kicked him in the stomach.
2. That three patients died in March, 1940, from electric shock treatment.
3. That Irwin Wakefield, a patient, was beaten to death by an attendant on April 11, 1944.

Ryan said three criminally insane patients attacked three attendants. Wakefield attacked an attendant with an iron bar. In the death struggle, the attendant killed Wakefield. A coroner's jury exonerated the attendants.

Better Food

Ryan told the board that feeding standards have been improved 50 per cent in the past three years. He said a typical noon meal consists of beef stew, corn on the cob, boiled potatoes, chocolate pudding, two fresh pears, bread and butter and coffee.

Voluntary

He said that 30 per cent of the new patients now voluntarily commit themselves to the hospital, compared with 20 per cent three years ago. He said "People do not volun-

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
