Regular Meeting—Shasta View grange will hold a regular meeting at Shasta school Thursday at 8 p.m. Grange ladies are asked to bring cookies.

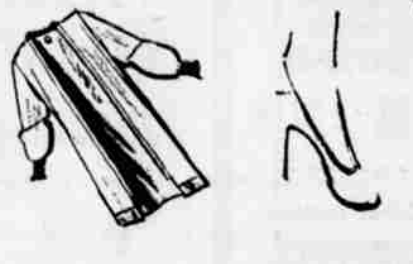
