

New Construction Aids In Combating Northwest Power Shortage Problem

PORTLAND, Oct. 13 (AP)—Continued progress in building transmission lines to meet the Pacific Northwest's power shortage is assured through another year, according to Paul J. Raver, Bonneville administrator.

When President Truman signed the interior department appropriation bill today, it made available \$44,534,000 for the 1949-50 Bonneville fiscal year, Raver said.

The money will be used on projects in Oregon, Washington, Northern Idaho and Montana.

The total sum includes \$26,284,500 for construction and \$4,000,000 for operation and maintenance. The bill also gives \$16,239,500 in contract authorizations, the administrator said.

Although the money is \$3,000,000 short of the president's budget request, it is about \$6,000,000 over the appropriation for the past fiscal year.

Major Items

Major items, Raver said, include permission to schedule such construction of the McNary-La Grande transmission facilities as may be necessary for a balanced power program; funds for completion of the \$20,000 volt Grand Coulee-Snohomish and Bonneville-Trousdale transmission lines to meet Puget Sound and Portland power shortages this winter; and funds to permit increased interchange of power through construction of the Spokane-Kerr-Kalispel-Hungry Horse and the Kerr-Anasconda lines.

Raver listed these projects as included in the approved bill:

Coastal Areas

1. Grid facilities for taking Grand Coulee power to Seattle, Longview, Portland and Southwest Oregon areas, \$16,521,450, including cash \$9,639,000 and \$6,882,450 contract authorization.

2. Facilities to serve Snohomish, Seattle, Olympia, Grays Harbor, Shelton and Port Angeles areas, \$4,491,100, including cash \$3,334,350 and contract authorization \$1,156,750.

3. Facilities to serve Longview, Chehalis, Southwest Washington, Portland and Salem areas \$4,674,150, including cash \$3,711,950 and \$962,200 contract authorization.

4. Facilities for Southwest Oregon, \$3,973,400, including cash \$2,721,100 and contract authorization \$1,252,300.

Central Area

1. Spokane facilities, \$2,154,050, including cash \$674,200 and contract authorization \$1,479,850.

2. Idaho panhandle, \$1,092,500, including cash \$955,650 and contract authorization \$136,850.

3. Oregon and Washington facilities, \$4,283,800, including cash \$2,617,800 and contract authorization \$1,666,000. Projects are midway substation additions, Columbia substation and Columbia-Elsenburg line, McNary-Pasco line, Richland-Kennewick line, Midway-Benton line, Benton-Franklin-Walla Walla line, Prosser substation, McNary-La Grande line, and Chief Joseph (Foster creek) construction service line.

General appropriations, including structures, communications, tools and equipment and miscellaneous total \$1,296,650, of which \$831,100 is cash and \$464,550 is contract authorization.

Salt Creek Body Identified

EUGENE, Oct. 13 (AP)—Lane County Deputy Coroner Fred Buell said last night that dental charts had confirmed the identification of a body found in Salt Creek as a victim of a 1945 traffic tragedy.

The skeleton was that of John A. Mitchell, Portlander whose car went off a road near Oakridge December 28, 1945. Mitchell's wife, his daughter and a son were killed also.

The family had lived at Portland, at the time of the Christmas week tragedy. They had moved from Spokane a year previously.

This Family Makes Life At Home Fun

CHICAGO, (AP)—Life in the Van Der Bosch family is perpetual fun. Mr. and Mrs. Edward Van Der Bosch and their nine children run family affairs like a business. Each young Van Der Bosch is assigned a chore, except Edward Jr., who is married and lives nearby.

The Van Der Boschs live in a converted two-family dwelling. The upper floor was made into a spacious dormitory. The lower apartment is used as the living area.

Roll Call

The roll call of children lists Richard, 23, Edward Jr., 23, Larry, 21, Betty, 17, George, 16, Jack, 15, Patricia, 12, Casey, 9, and Terry, 7. Six of the children are in school, with two boys attending college.

Dad Van Der Bosch operates a wholesale produce business, he consults the chalked bulletin board installed at home for daily instructions the same as the kids do. Family conferences decide who does what.

Early this year Casey brought up the subject of mother Van Der Bosch's scolding about being late for dinner after she rang the bell. "We've got to come down the front stairs and walk clear back to the dining room in the rear. That's awful far," he said.

Casey suggested a fireman's pole be placed between the floors of the back porch. It would be a quick slide to the dinner plate.

A few days later a fireman friend had found one. Workmen cut a two-foot square opening in the floor of the second story porch and installed the brass pole. Every member of the family uses it.

"The gang gets to the table in less than a minute" papa Van Der Bosch said.

Label Violations In Portland

PORTLAND, Oct. 13 (AP)—Mis-labeled milk and cream has cropped out on the city market again, according to the state milk marketing administration.

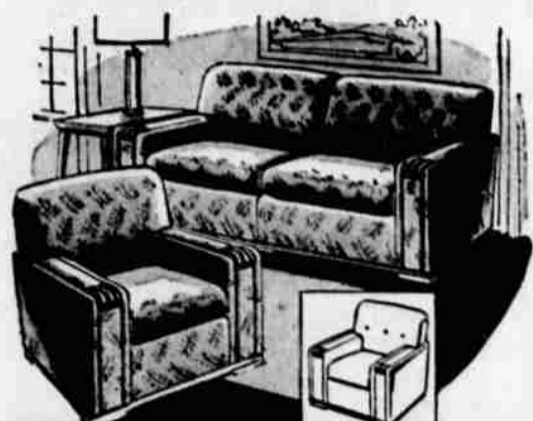
Administrator Thomas Ohlson said distributors would be warned of code violations. These may be followed by criminal complaints of willful intent to defraud the public, he said.

State Agriculture Director E. L. Peterson said he may undertake a cleanup of labeling practices in up-state communities. He said there is no specific milk labeling law outside of Portland, but many dealers voluntarily label their product. Errors could be prosecuted under the state farm products labeling law, Peterson reported.

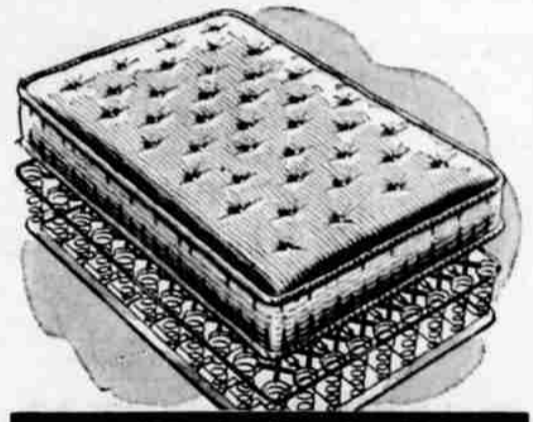
