Frost Trial Postponed

A criminal trial scheduled for Monday in circuit court has been postponed indefinitely.

The scheduled trial was that of Russell Frost of Sprague River, indicted on a charge of selling liquor to an Indian.

Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg disqualified himself from presiding over the trial because it was at his request from the bench that Frost was arrested after a young Indian said in court he had purchased whiskey from Frost.

No Judge — The postponement was ordered because no other judge had been assigned the case. Frost is free on bail.

Jury subpoenas and witness summons have already been issued but are being recalled and the jury panel instructed to be in court October 24, date set for trial of Virgil B. Woodrum on the first of two indictments charging indecent exposure.
