Church Casts Out Bride; May Appeal

NEW YORK, Oct. 15 (AP)—A pretty society bride, excommunicated from the Roman Catholic church, may, if she wishes, seek to have the ban lifted.

A chancery official of the Catholic archdiocese of New York, headed by Francis Cardinal Spellman, says the next move is up to her.

She is the former Claire Elizabeth McGinnis of San Francisco, who was married Monday to Ivan Obolensky, son of a former Russian prince and an heir to the John Jacob Astor fortune.

The Catholic church declared her excommunicated because she had gone through a wedding in the bridegroom's church, the Russian Orthodox, following a Roman Catholic ceremony.

If she wishes to remain a Catholic, a chancery official said, she must confer with church officials to find out what penance she must do to have the ban removed.

Friends of the bride said she was too upset to make any comment immediately.

Only Catholic The excommunication announcement said the couple had agreed in writing there would be only the Catholic marriage ceremony.

However, young Obolensky later issued a statement saying that if he signed any such agreement "I can only say the effect of it was not fully realized by me."

Excommunication bars a Catholic from all the sacraments, deemed by the church to be essential to salvation.
