

Ship Burns and Sinks In Pacific; Dramatic Rescue Saves 17 Men

SEATTLE, Oct. 18 (AP)—A "nick of time" rescue saved 17 seamen from the wind-frothed North Pacific last night after fire turned their wooden lumber schooner, the Salina Cruz, into a blackened, broken hulk.

The officers and men were picked up by the U. S. fish and wildlife service vessel Black Douglas just as one of their two lifeboats was awash and sinking.

Recovered

The Douglas reported early today all of the sailors had recovered from their ordeal, and she was proceeding to her home port of San Francisco. Arrival there was expected Thursday.

The dramatic rescue a few hours after nightfall 140 miles west of Grays Harbor, Wash., was carried out in heavy seas kicked up by a 25-knot wind. Coast guard search planes that had been circling overhead throughout the day guided the Douglas to the scene.

Foundering

Ten of the men in one of the open lifeboats had managed to keep afloat without difficulty. They were the first ones spotted by the Douglas. An hour later, after the second boat had sent up direction flares, the seven remaining survivors were pulled from their foundering craft.

All members of the Salina Cruz crew were Mexicans, with the exception of the master, Capt. Benjamin F. Ivey of Long Beach, Calif., and one or two of his officers, the coast guard said.

Stark Seeks Council Aid In Air Fight

Chamber of Commerce Manager Charles Stark urged the city council last night to support the chamber in its attempt to prevent abolition of air service from Klamath Falls northbound to the Canadian border.

Stark stated that an abolition hearing designated as the "West-coast certificate renewal" case is slated for action by the civil aeronautics board in the near future.

He wanted action from the city council in concurring with the chamber's intervention petition to the CAB.

Concurrence

The council decided that they would concur in this respect rather than filing a separate petition.

Stark added that although the southbound abolition hearing had been completed, the CAB had decided not to render a decision until the northbound case had been finished.

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Tatman Raps Renting Of Equipment

Councilman G. C. Tatman reprimanded the recreation and park departments at the council meeting last night for their policy of renting road equipment from outside sources when the city had such equipment available.

Tatman made reference to one instance when a loading shovel was rented by the park department to fix a break in the canal dike and the street department had a shovel available.

Ski Run, Rink

He added that now the recreation department is requesting funds for rental of a bulldozer from a private source to fix up a ski run and skating rink for the winter. He declared he could not see why this was necessary when the city already had such a piece of equipment available for rental at special inter-departmental rates.

The city fathers agreed that the mayor should direct a letter to the park board stating that city road equipment is available for use by other departments at the special rates.

Cute Kittens, Wild Little Imps

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Tennessee Mountain Feud Rivals Famed Hatfield-McCoy War

DAISY, Tenn., Oct. 18 (AP)—Daisy mountain's moonshine feud bids fair to take its place with the famed Hatfield and McCoy squabble in southern mountain history.

Sparked during a dispute over the making of corn whiskey and fanned by bitter hatred, the feud flamed anew over the week-end. Another man was killed on the lonely mountainside—the third to die since the hill country war began two years ago.

Body Found

Police found William L. (Boots) Parker lying on a muddy slope of the mountain Saturday night, shot three times and bludgeoned with an ax.

Raymond Bell, 29, was found at the scene, two ax wounds on his head. Bell and his brother, Ed, 23, were arrested and Chief Deputy Scott Swafford charged them with murder. They face arraignment tomorrow.

Officers have redoubled patrols on the mountain but have met with the same tight-lipped silence that greeted them after the two previous deaths: No one knows anything about the slaying.

Close Mounded

"It's hard to get those people on the mountain to talk," says Sheriff Frank Burns.

Evidence has been sparse whenever one of the mountaineers has been tried for a killing. Several persons recently were indicted on murder charges in the first two deaths. Three trials were held and all were acquitted.

For a while it seemed there would be peace on the mountain. A representative of each faction appeared on a nationwide radio broadcast (We the People) last December and proclaimed an end to the feud. It evidently didn't take.

'Hot Pineapple' Drivers Sue CIO

PORTLAND, Oct. 18 (AP)—Two truck drivers, injured when a "hot cargo" dispute boiled into violence at The Dalles, sued the CIO longshore union for damages yesterday.

Clarence Rosales, 36, San Jose, Calif., asked \$109,000 for injuries he said would prevent him from again driving a truck. Raymond Curto, 42, San Jose, asked \$38,400. Both men were in a hospital at The Dalles after the fighting in which they were dragged from their trucks.

They were to have trucked Hawaiian pineapple from a barge at The Dalles to San Jose.

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Girl's Kiss Worth A Caning?

LONDON, Oct. 18 (AP)—Is a school girl's kiss worth a caning? Peter Freeman, laborite, will ask that question of Education Minister

George Tomlinson in the house of commons Thursday.

Freeman said six boys were caned at Chamberlayne Road school last July for kissing girls.

He wants to know if the whipping was in accordance with the education minister's regulations.

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
