## Leopold Puts Fate in Hands Of Citizens

BRUSSELS, Belgium, Oct. 19 (AP)—The exiled King Leopold has agreed to a vote by the Belgian people to decide whether he shall return to the throne.

Senator Julius Hoste, announcing this yesterday, said the king will abdicate if fewer than 55 per cent of the voters favor his return.

Previously Leopold had said the decision on his return was up to the Belgian parliament, and that any vote by the people would be merely advisory.

Leopold has been in exile since the war.
