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Don't Waste Makings Of Good Compost Pile

By J. D. VERTREES Assistant County Agent Leaves, lawn clippings and garden refuse are money! Don't waste them. Fall is a good time to start that garden compost pile. The county agent's office suggests that instead of burning the leaves of the shade trees, convert them into compost. Include lawn clippings and tops, vines and other refuse which are being cleaned from the garden in the fall. Any vegetable matter is quite useful. Organic compost is very valuable to enrich the soil in the garden. It is money in your pocket as one of the cheapest and best fertilizers available.

How It's Done Make successive layers of leaves, clippings and other vegetable waste built up to a 12 inch depth. Cover this with a layer of Nitrogen fertilizer or barnyard, chicken or rabbit manure. Follow this layer with a covering of good soil about 3 inches deep. Repeat these successive layers in order to build up the compost pile, keeping each layer well watered down to hurry the rotting process. After two or three months, the pile should be mixed, turned and

replied. This will speed up decomposition. Use this valuable composition to enrich the garden soil and flower beds. Details on composts are available from the county agents office.

LOS ANGELES—Thomas E. Clarke, 78, has climbed Mt. Whitney for the 13th time. His only complaint about his late jaunt was the heavy traffic on the trail and the discourtesy of some climbers, whom he compared to Sunday drivers. "I was knocked down several times," he said, "and I don't get up so quick as I used to."
