

### Rancher Gets Deer With Pocket Knife

SEATTLE, Oct. 20 (AP)—Clarence A. Rees killed a deer with his bare hands and the inch-and-a-half long blade of his pocket knife.

Exhibiting a bruised shoulder, a torn and bloody shirt—and the two-point buck deer weighing 110 pounds—the Kent resident said he would "never do it again. Not ever."

He was looking over the cows at his farm when the deer suddenly jumped from the brush at his side. Acting without thought, he grasped its horns.

"Then I was afraid to let go," Rees remembered.

"He knocked me over on my back, with him on top, but I held him. I choked him until his tongue was hanging out. I guess mine was, too."

Getting the knife out of his pocket and opening the blade, all with one hand, "was the hardest part of the whole thing," said Rees. He stabbed the deer in the throat. "I guess the whole thing lasted about five minutes, but it was all dynamite."

Rees had purchased a hunting license, but had expected to get his deer in the conventional manner, with a rifle.

### Dwarf Cattle Being Bred At Yakima

YAKIMA, Oct. 20 (AP)—Forget the helicopter and secret canyons. If you want to see some dwarf cattle, Yakima Rancher Roy Dane suggests you just drop out to his place at Harrah, about 30 miles south of here.

Dane scoffed at mysteries of the midget bovines reported by Gene Holter of Jamestown, N. D. Holter said he had found a wild herd of small cattle, 25 to 28 inches high, in a "secret canyon" and had flown them out by helicopter.

"I bought mine at a livestock auction in Portland two and a half years ago for \$20," Dane remarked.

"Expecting" The Yakima rancher said he has been raising the six tiny animals, five heifers and a bull, for the last two years. None has reproduced as yet, but Dane said one of the heifers is "expecting." Whether the offspring will revert to normal size is a question yet to be answered.

The bull is largest of the six animals, measuring 36 inches high, Dane said.

SALEM, Oct. 20 (AP)—World War II veterans have preference in acquiring 50 farms near Caldwell, Ida., the state veterans department said yesterday.

The land totals 4489 acres of irrigable public land. It is undeveloped and mostly covered with sagebrush. It is good for dairying, and production of alfalfa, pasture, clover, wheat, oats, barley and peas.

Applications must be filed before next January 3 with the bureau of reclamation, Notus, Idaho. Applicants must have \$3500 in cash or assets.
