**OTI** — The medical tech class was entertained at the home of the class instructor, Charles Martin, on Friday evening. Refreshments were served later following a social hour.

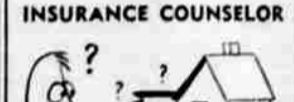

If the garage is attached to the house, it should be included in the total amount of insurance on the main building. If the garage is separate from the house, it should be insured separately for its own value. This also applies to the tool shed.

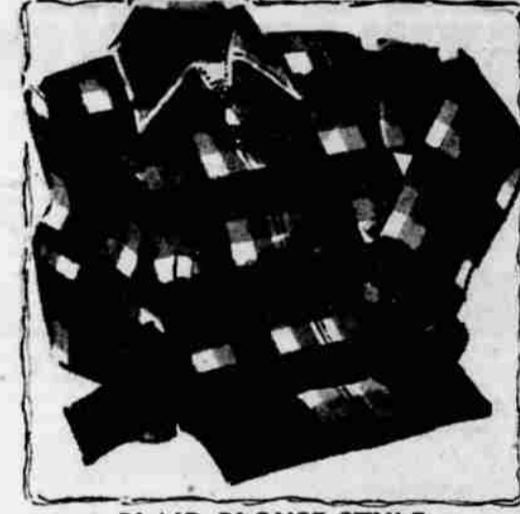

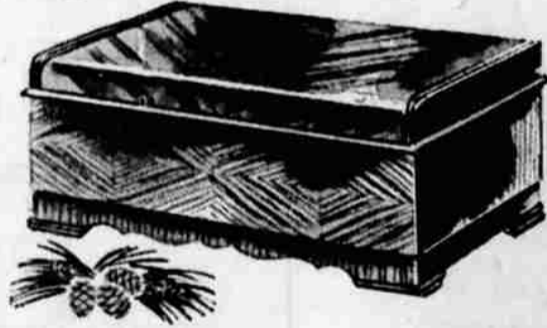
