

Hulett Makes Plea 'Guilty'

NEWELL. — Clarence Hulett, 46, Negro labor contractor and camp head at Newell, changed his plea of not guilty to guilty here at 10 Saturday morning and on the seven counts drew fines totaling \$500 from Justice of the Peace Katie Doolittle, presiding in Tulalake township.

The contractor had been charged with various offenses including operating a house of prostitution, gambling and liquor sales following a raid on the camp a week ago. It is understood that Hulett is leaving for the south Monday. His six months' sentence, which went along with the \$500 fine, was suspended on good behavior.

Henry Jettich, 36, and Rufus Hall, both Negroes and charged with running gambling games, also changed their plea to guilty and were fined \$50 each.
