**EASTERN OREGON:** Generally fair today and Wednesday. Little change in temperature with high both days 60 to 70. Low tonight 28 to 34.

**ROGUE RIVER VALLEY:** Fair afternoon and considerable fog and smoke night and mornings today through Wednesday. High both days 70. Low tonight 24.

**NORTHERN CALIFORNIA:** Fair today and Wednesday except for variable high cloudiness north of San Francisco and Sacramento Wednesday. # 23 Years Ago

Monday, October 25, 1926 — (Editorial) — With its usual primitive ideas and its snug repose the Eugene Register takes on a worried look over the possibility of Klamath Falls becoming a jobbing center and the long line of intelligent brothers who pasture around Eugene will be eating their oatmeal shipped to them from Klamath one of these days. This will all happen, regardless of the theoretical chap who evidently is editing the Register while Brother Jenkins is playing golf. The Register's editorials no longer have the Jenkins ring, but sound very much like some under-study of the wholesale school of journalism which happens to be a part of the university around which Eugene is built.

Tuesday, October 26, 1926—Just nine, no more, thronged the Midland schoolhouse to listen to candidates for county office speak at a candidates meeting last night.

Wednesday, October 27, 1926—Realizing a profit of slightly more than \$20,000 on an initial investment of \$3,000, Bob Coyne, owner of the Edgewood ranch and former Hollywood realtor, today reported sale of the Lavina Harpaugh ranch at Olene for \$23,400. Buyer is D. S. Daugherty, formerly of Idaho.

Thursday, October 28, 1926—Klamath's population of Chinese pheasants was increased today by 274 of the game birds which arrived last night from the state game bird farm at Eugene. It is the first shipment of pheasants liberated in Klamath for three years.

Friday, October 29, 1926—"Yes, Portland is a busy city but nothing to be compared with Klamath Falls," Paul Landry stated this morning upon returning from the northern metropolis where he spent several days in the interests of the loan for the Kerns building.
