

Three Sprague Bridges To Be Ready in Spring

Traffic will not roll over all three of the brand new Sprague river spans this winter, but by spring the bridges will present some fine work accomplished in this territory by the Oregon state highway department.

Of the three bridges, the largest span is Lons Pine and was put in use without fanfare in mid-September. The bridge is 240 feet long and is six miles east of Bedford bridge which was partially destroyed by fire while under construction last winter.

The Bedford span, 185 feet long, is shortest of the three under construction by Perkins Brothers of Portland. At considerable expense, tests were made of the concrete core of the various support to determine damage, and it was necessary to re-finish the concrete surface to repair fire damage.

The deck on Bedford Bridge was poured before the fire. On Friday, the crews will pour the last of the

concrete for the handrails and now all that remains is the polishing of the rails and surfaces. The next step is not up to the contractors, but up to the Indian service to complete the fills at the approaches. This should be done during the coming months and Bedford open to traffic by January 1.

Weather has much to do with the work on the third span—known as Sprague River bridge, according to O. Roy Kennen, state highway bridge engineer. This is a 215-foot span but has caused the greatest concern due to the depth of the river at the point where the bridge will cross. Engineers found a 20-foot depth from the bottom of the footings to the deck and it has been extremely difficult to make the cofferdams at each footing sufficiently watertight to make successful pourings. Thus far 21 footings have been poured and there are only three to go.

The first span of the deck has been poured on the northwest end and weather permitting crews should pour up to the center of the bridge within 10 days.

Race Perkins Brothers have 22 men working on the bridges at this point and they are attempting a race with the weather, remember last year's fight with cold, snow and wind. If there is an open winter, Kennen observed, all the concrete will be poured by the first of the year, otherwise it will be early spring. But by late spring or early summer, all work on the three bridges will be done, opening up a fine drive in that section of Klamath county.

U.S. Mediator To Tackle OC&E Trouble

A mediator from the national railway mediation board is scheduled to be in Klamath Falls November 7 in an effort to bring officials of the Oregon, California and Eastern railway and the conductor's union together on points which recently caused a 38-day strike on the road.

C. L. Michael, OC&E conductor and union chairman here, received word that the date for the parley had been set.

The order of railway conductors struck the OC&E August 27 and remained out on strike until October 2 when the 13 strikers voted 11-2 to return to work under a truce while mediation of the strike issues was tried.

W. F. Mitchell Jr. of Long Beach, representative of the mediation board, probably will be assigned the job here. He will attempt to bring the railroad, represented by I. E. Manion and other officers, together with O. W. Lange and other officers of the conductors' union.

Manion, from Seattle, is general manager of the Great Northern and serves as president of the OC&E while the 65-mile Klamath Falls-to-Bly is operated by GN.

The conductors' union struck OC&E over six points of friction between the company and the employees and none of the points were settled during several days of negotiations while the strike was going on.

The mediator will start anew on all points of discussion.

Lake Chest Quota Set At \$11,033

LAKEVIEW—With an \$11,033.36 quota established by the board of directors Monday night, the Lake County Community Chest was set today to open its 1949 funds drive Friday, October 28. The quota includes \$9,171.36 for 11 local agencies and \$1832 for 15 agencies in the Oregon State Chest.

Agencies that participate in Chest funds must agree to conduct no funds drive of their own during the year. If the quota is not reached for some reason, the funds will be allocated to the agencies on a percentage basis. If the quota is over-subscribed, the excess will be held and applied to next year's Chest drive. This year there was \$108 on hand from last year's drive.

Tideland Leasing To Be Tested

PORTLAND, Oct. 26 (AP)—The Oregon state land board, which began leasing river tidelands about two years ago, plans to bring a test suit to find out if the policy is legal.

Columbia Empire Industries, Incorporated, an association of industrial firms, protested the leasing policy, saying farmers don't have to obtain leases.

The present method requires industries to pay for the right to lease property between high and low tide lines.
