Revel, will address the group on the food and agriculture organization — that part of the United Nations which aims to help people lift themselves to higher standards of food production and nutrition. "Unesco," (the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) will be the subject of the third speaker, Mrs. Ivan Thompson. Question and discussion periods will follow each speaker's presentation of her topic after which a dramatic skit, "Peace is Possible," under the direction of the Rev. Godfrey Matthews will be presented.

The council project on this World Community Day will be the shipment of great quantities of materials, cloth, both cotton and woolen; thread for sewing and embroidering, wool for knitting and crocheting. This project being carried out throughout the United States to aid the women of Europe and Asia to make clothing for themselves and their families. Women of the local council are urged to remember that most recipients have no needles, thread, tape and probably no good shears and are asked to include as many of these items as possible. The materials each woman prepares for presentation at the dedication service, November 4 are to be wrapped in a yard or a half of blue denim for overall patching and are to be tied securely.
