He was greeted with a 21-gun salute. The ship's band played "God Save the King" for him. The whole crew turned out and span for a deck-by-deck royal inspection.

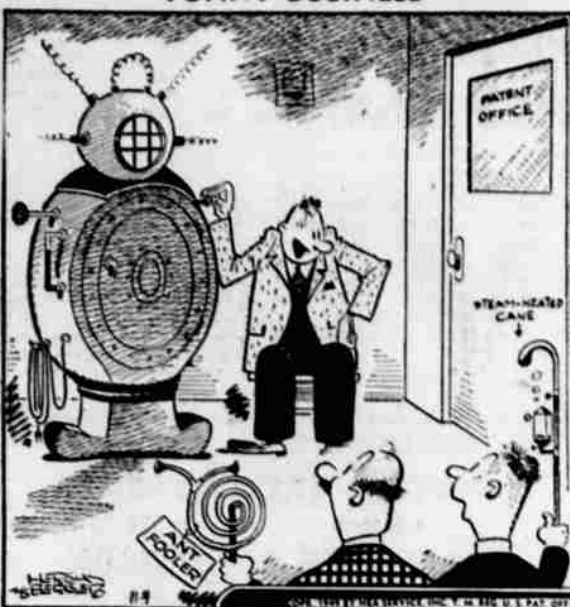

Morse Dubs 81st Senate Coalition, Not Two-Party

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9 (AP)—Senator Morse (R-Ore.) said in a statement released here today the people should recognize that the senate in its last session was not a two-party system in operation "but a coalition of conservative republicans and democrats."

"It represented a new political alignment in fact if not in name," Morse said.

"It was a powerful coalition; too powerful for the liberals because there are not enough liberals in either the democratic or republican party in the senate to out-vote the coalition of reactionaries."

The senator, now in Oregon to campaign for reclamation, made his statement public through his office here. He said the first session of the 81st congress "will undoubtedly go down in congressional history as the coalition congress."

The public housing units in and around Klamath Falls have paid \$9187.64 in Klamath county in lieu of current property taxes, Edith Briggs, general housing manager, Briggs, general housing manager, announced today.

The payments are made annually for service received from the various local governmental bodies operating from tax funds. Payment to the Klamath county tax collector's office was \$2046.11; to the Klamath Falls city treasurer \$200.39; to the suburban fire district \$1010.11; to elementary school district No. 1 \$3496.14, and to Klamath Union high school district \$2425.89.

HOSPITAL APPROVED
ROSEBURG, Nov. 9 (AP)—Final approval of a \$156,000 federal grant for the construction of the Douglas community hospital has been given by the U. S. public health service.

Fifteen feet long and 13 inches at its widest point, the fish has a small head, long sucker mouth, big gills, a long pink crest and two long thick feelers protruding beneath its mouth. A pink fin runs the length

of its body, which is heavily coated with phosphorus and dotted with large black spots. It has no scales.
