

Court Ban of Pinballs Further Muddles Funds Strife in Washington

OLYMPIA, Wash., Nov. 10 (AP)—State officials pondered a state supreme court decision today to see if the jurists had dropped another bomb into Washington's muddled financial picture.

Five members of the court ruled unanimously yesterday that pinball machines are gambling devices and prohibited by state law. The decision was handed down in overruling a Spokane county superior court order prohibiting the city from enforcing an ordinance banning the machines.

2nd Cave-in Victim's Body Removed

SEATTLE, Nov. 10 (AP)—The body of the second of two men trapped in a cave-in of a 60-foot shaft on the University of Washington campus, was recovered last night.

Last to be removed was the body of Ed L. Olson of Seattle. He and a companion worker, James McNabb of Auburn, were buried beneath tons of dirt and timber Tuesday forenoon. McNabb's body was recovered yesterday.

The cave-in, in tunneling designed to carry heat and electricity conduits to university buildings, was blamed yesterday by C. B. Jacobs, state mine inspector, upon "inadequate timbering" in the shaft.

Four other shafts were ordered closed until work has been done to strengthen them.

Shippers Fight Truckage Boost

PORTLAND, Nov. 10 (AP)—Spokesmen for shippers testified yesterday against freight rate boosts asked by Oregon truckers.

George M. Martin, official of the Utah Canning company, Milton, said any boost would menace the competitive position of Northwest canneries. He said the profit margin in the industry already was too low. He spoke for the Northwest Canners association.

H. A. Holmes, representing Medford area fruit growers, said the industry couldn't afford higher rates. He urged the state utilities commission examiners to exempt fresh fruits from any rate increase.

Dorothy Lee's Recall, Dud

PORTLAND, Nov. 10 (AP)—The committee working for the recall of Mayor Dorothy McCullough Lee is about to call it quits.

The members made the decision last night after 21 persons turned out for a public rally. The treasury is almost bare, too, and there are 33 days remaining to obtain all but a few of the needed 26,000 signatures on special election petitions.

Committee Attorney Max Donnelly said a final decision would be made Saturday. It hinges on the money question, he said.

Grounded Ship Breaking Up

SEATTLE, Nov. 10 (AP)—The 7700-ton freighter Andalucia broke amidships on its rocky underwater pinnacle last night and today, the coast guard said, the bow and stern sections are about 100 feet apart.

A three-man salvage crew, which went aboard last evening to attempt removal of the vessel's deck cargo of lumber, was removed when the ship began to crack.

The Andalucia went aground last Friday when the master attempted to beach her after fire broke out in the engine room.

Standing at strategic street corners, Optimist members handed out certificates to pedestrians with the broadest smiles. Each certificate was exchangeable for a brand new silver dollar.



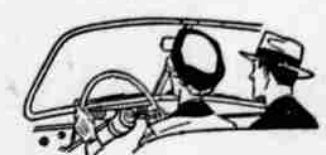

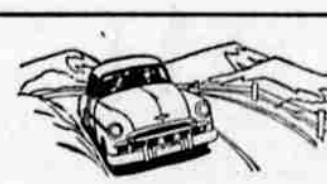
