

# Morse Reaffirms CVA Opposition; Klamath Water Threat Raised

PORTLAND, Nov. 10 (AP)—Senator Wayne Morse told an audience last night he would have plenty to say about CVA when he campaigns for reelection.

"I expressed my views on pending CVA legislation in my October 14 speech. In my campaign I will enlarge on those views, but I have not yet begun my campaign," he said.

### Other Opposition

Earlier, other speakers before the banquet session of the 37th Annual Oregon Reclamation congress had opposed the Columbia valley administration proposal. They were applauded.

Morse talked primarily on economy in some services. He said he

thought national defense budgets could be trimmed three billion dollars without harming security.

Omar Spencer, Portland, congress president, reported Oregon now has 54 active irrigation districts involving 463,694 acres. Kent Leavitt, New York dairy farmer and president of the National Association of Soil Conservation Districts, said Oregon needed more soil work. He urged the 100 delegates to become more interested in proper land management.

**Klamath Water**  
La Salle Coles, Prineville, said Oregon should push water resources development. He said if this wasn't done, California might demand use of the moisture, particularly in the Klamath area.

## 18th State OK's Vets Bonus Plan

Approval of a state bonus for World War II veterans in Pennsylvania raises to at least 18 the number of states granting such payments.

The proposal carried by an overwhelming margin in Tuesday's election in the Keystone state.

It calls for an outlay of a half billion dollars, with a maximum bonus of \$500 for an ex-serviceman. The payment would be made on the basis of \$15 for each month spent overseas and \$10 for each month in the U. S.

A similar proposal apparently lost in New Jersey.

### Broadened

New York voters decided to broaden the bonus plan which they approved in 1948. By a two to one count, they approved an amendment to allow payments to former New York states who moved elsewhere after release from service.

The total amount payable to veterans in the 18 states which have okayed bonuses approaches \$2,500,000,000 (B). Five states have flatly rejected bonuses. They are Maine, Nebraska, Oregon, Wisconsin and Missouri.

### Considering

Several other states are still considering bonus proposals. Washington state's bonus was approved by the state supreme court last Saturday after having once been invalidated in its original form.

The issue, long debated among local milk distributors and school officials, centers on a one-half cent increase charged to schools for the half-pint bottles of milk.

Lewis has been chairman of the board of directors. Dacie Hoover, Ada Barleen and Katherine Smith will serve as election judges.

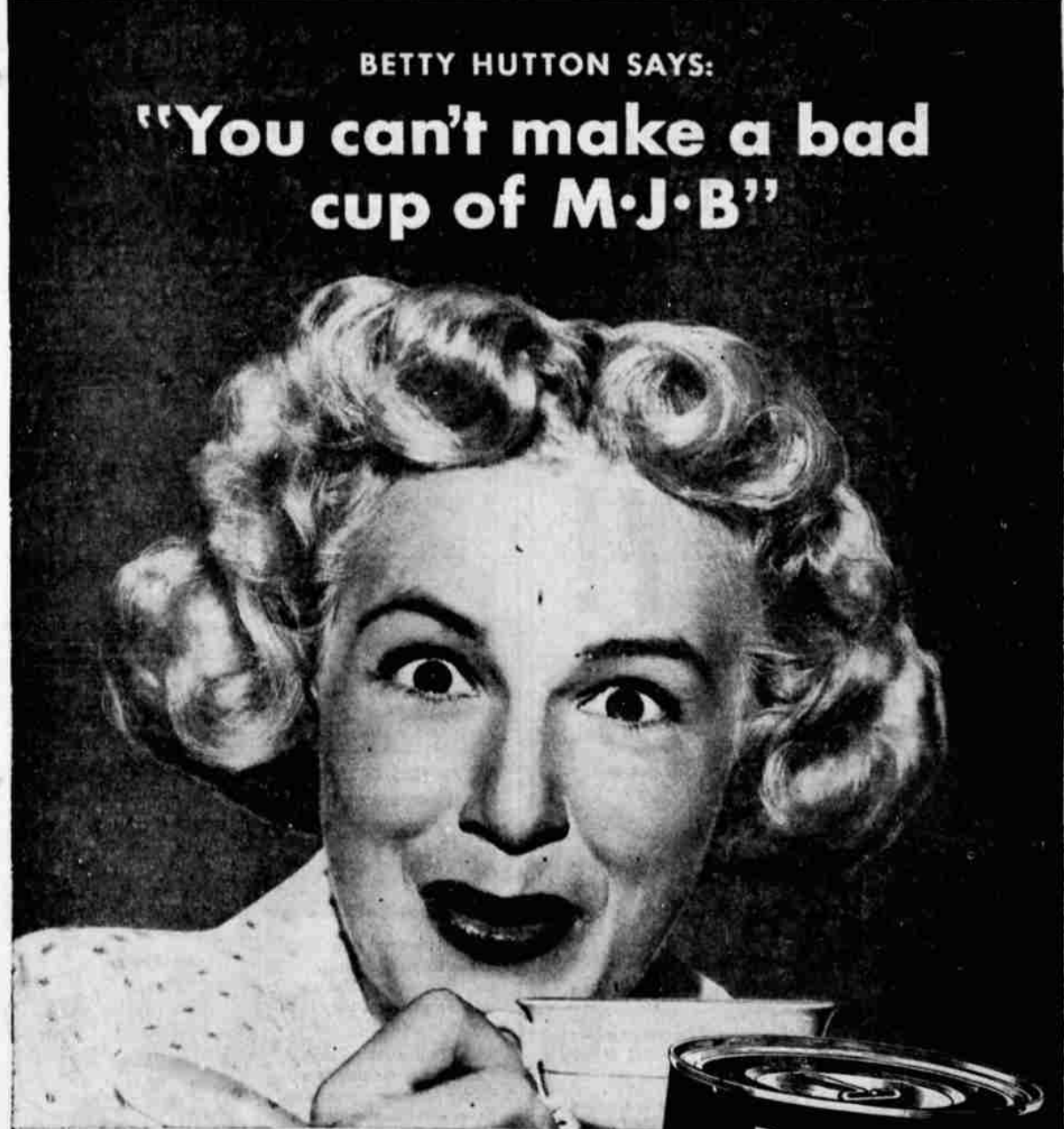
## Hit Parking Meter, Fined \$50
