Damaged U. S. Sub Heads for Port
GROTON, Conn., Nov. 10 (AP)—The submarine Tusk, damaged yesterday in a collision with the supply ship Alderbaran in maneuvers off Labrador, was proceeding under escort today to the U. S. naval base at Argentia, Newfoundland.

A destroyer is accompanying the damaged undersea craft, a submarine base spokesman said. He declared there had been no injuries or loss of life in the accident.

The Tusk, commanded by commander Robert E. P. Worthington, 34, of Oakmont, Pa., figured in the dramatic rescue of the crew of another submarine which exploded and sank off the coast of Norway last August. Worthington directed the rescue.
