Imre Kovacs Next Knife, Fork Speaker

Imre Kovacs, the brilliant young Hungarian-American lecturer, writer, traveler and student of European and American social conditions and problems, will be the guest speaker at the dinner of the Klamath Knife and Fork club which will be held at the Willard hotel November 14.

Kovacs was born in Pancsova, Hungary, on the Danube, of a Hungarian father and a German mother and received his formal education in Hungary, Germany, Serbia, Roumania and the United States. After completing his work at the Yale graduate school he went to Yugoslavia for the YMCA and later traveled in nine European countries where he studied social and economic conditions.

Challenge
 Louis Adamic's statement, "Some people are born in America; others, no matter where they were born, were born American," is amply supported by Kovacs' life, and what America means to him is a real challenge to all of us to exert our best efforts in supporting this, the land of our birth or our adoption.

In addition to English, which he speaks fluently, Kovacs is the master of six other European languages. During the past four years he has addressed over a million people. Everywhere his remarks have been received with enthusiasm. In addition to being a keen student of social conditions, he has a fine voice and knows how to put over a lecture in a manner which never fails to win approval.
