City Bank Deposits \$29,124,345

In answer to a November call from the comptroller of currency, the three Klamath Falls banks reported total deposits of \$29,124,345—a composite increase of nearly two and a half million in four months.

The increase is considered normal, a fluctuation due to the harvest season when more cash is normally in circulation.

General

The increase was general in all three institutions:

First National bank (Klamath Falls branch) reported November 1 deposits of \$15,989,634, compared to \$14,739,065 June 30.

First National bank (S. 6th branch) reported November 1 deposits of \$863,754, compared to \$853,583 June 30.

U. S. National bank reported November 1 deposits of \$11,590,957, compared to \$11,199,345 June 30.

Loans

FEED GRAINS' PRICES EASE

CHICAGO, Nov. 12 (AP)—Feed grains eased on the board of trade today, corn dropping another cent at one time before staging a mild rally. The downturn in part represented profit-taking following advances earlier this week.

Wheat and soybeans eased earlier in the day with the feed grains, but came back in the latter trade.

Wheat closed unchanged to 1/4 higher, December \$2.11 1/4, corn was 1/4 lower, December \$1.20 1/4, oats were unchanged to 1/4 lower, December 74 1/2, rye was unchanged to 1/4 higher, December \$1.34 1/4, soybeans were 1/4 lower to 1 1/4 higher, November \$2.20 1/4-2 1/4, and lard was unchanged to 5 cents a hundred pounds higher, November \$9.55.

Gold Stocks Weaken Again

NEW YORK, Nov. 12 (AP)—Gold stocks took another beating in today's market.

Gold's weakened abruptly on Thursday following President Truman's decisive statement that the price of gold would not be raised above \$35 an ounce as long as he is president. Losses today ran to more than a point, with Homestake and McIntyre Porcupine off around a point each at one time. Some declined fractionally.

The balance of the market puttered along more or less aimlessly. Turnover hit a rate of about 500,000 for the two-hour session.

Unchanged to a bit higher most of the time were U. S. Steel, General Motors, Chrysler, Goodrich, Montgomery Ward, Safeway Stores, American Telephone and U. S. Gypsum.

Balky spots included U. S. Rubber, Lockheed, Radio Corp., North American Co., Anaconda Copper, Union Pacific, Texas Co. and Johnsonville.

Blaze Marks Intensify Flier Search

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Nov. 12 (AP)—Search for a long missing flier was intensified today after discovery of five blaze marks on trees in the wilderness north of here.

The missing man is Francis Brownfield. He has been missing since September 5 when he left a hunter on a river bar. His crashed plane was found later.

The blaze marks were reported yesterday running upstream from a cabin where he had stayed. He had left a note in the cabin. The blaze marks were found by trapper Oscar Vogel and Lt. William A. Weed, 10th rescue squadron helicopter pilot. They were out on trees 30 to 40 feet apart.

Danger

The two men reported that Brownfield had taken about 120 pounds of food and supplies from the cabin. They expressed the belief he picked up enough supplies to last him through December, but said at the same time there is danger he might have fallen over one of the many cliffs in the rugged area.

Brownfield's wife and his father, Muri Brownfield of Sequim, Wash., have joined in searching flights.

LIVESTOCK

CHICAGO, Nov. 12 (AP)—Hogs were quoted nominally within a \$1.25 to \$16.50 range today, steady with yesterday's price range. Cattle and sheep also were nominally steady.

Hogs suffered a severe decline during the first four days this week, all offerings on Thursday selling below the former OPA ceiling of \$16.25. The ceiling was removed on October 15, 1946. Next week the "guide price"—an average of barrows and gilts at seven markets—will drop 40 cents to \$15.45.

Slaughter steers closed steady to 50 cents higher compared with last week-end. Slaughter lambs fell \$1.00 in a weak trade.
