Frost was indicted last June after 18-year-old Simeon Buchanan Riddle of Sprague River said he bought a quart of Cream of Ken-Tee price, the Indian youth said, was \$10.

Circuit Judge E. H. Howell of John Day, 34 years old and one of the youngest judges of the Oregon bench, has been assigned to hear the case. Judge David R. Vandenberg disqualified himself. Frost is defended by Attorney E. E. Driscoll.

Quick action by a neighborhood bucket brigade doused what could have been a serious blaze at the Hal Ogle residence, 620 Washington, about 9:20 last night.

The blaze started in a basement apartment occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Don Palmer and their three young children, and was probably caused by an over-heated stovepipe.

Bedfast Mrs. Ogle, confined to bed with arthritis, called the fire department when she smelled smoke which had drifted up from the apartment below. In the meantime the Palmers rushed their children out of the house and the bucket brigade saved the day.

Acting Chief Jack Corkery said one wall of the basement apartment was badly damaged before the flames were quenched. There was no damage done the upper part of the house, although it was filled with smoke. Mrs. Ogle was helped to the front porch of the building by neighbors and was unharmed.

**New Fire Suit Tested OK**

DAYTON, O., Nov. 12 (AP)—The air force now can keep its fire fighters reasonably cool in the hottest crash flames. The air force engineering division at nearby Wright-Patterson field today announced successful tests of a new glass-fiber suit that keeps firemen at a 130-degree body temperature in 2000-degree flames. The suit, only one of its kind, is constructed of 18 layers of glass fiber, and — among other materials — glass fiber net, neoprene-coated glass fiber, honeycombed cotton cloth, silver foil, aluminum foil and nylon.
