James Pruett From Clerk To Official

James H. Pruett Jr., who was appointed general passenger agent of the northern district of Southern Pacific, began his railroad career with Southern Pacific as a clerk in the division superintendent's office at El Paso.

Later he served as ticket clerk at San Antonio and at Houston, Tex., as city passenger agent at St. Louis and as district passenger agent at Boston.

Pruett's appointment was announced recently by Claude E. Peterson, vice president in charge of passenger traffic. Pruett succeeds J. A. Ormandy, who retires November 30 after 41 years of service with the SP company in Portland.

In 1943 Pruett was transferred west as district passenger agent to assist in handling military traffic on the Monterey peninsula, and the following year moved to Palo Alto as district passenger agent. He was appointed special assistant to Vice President Peterson in San Francisco in July, 1947, his present post. Accompanying Pruett to Portland to make their home will be Mrs. Pruett and their two small sons, who will be entering Portland schools within a few weeks. An older son, James H. Pruett IV, is attending Admiral Farragut Academy in New Jersey, preparing for Annapolis.

Video Football Improves

NEW YORK, (AP)—Increase in the number of cameras has considerably heightened the overall effect of football television.

One of the extra cameras has been placed in the end zone to produce a head-on scene when a kick is made. Generally the other cameras, as many as three, are put at about the 50-yard line so that entire field can be spanned.

Each camera obtains closeup as well as intermediate and distance lenses so that the variety of views can be increased further.

Punchboard Trouble In Portland

PORTLAND, Nov. 17 (AP)—Portland is having punchboard trouble again.

Nobody can decide whether a certain question-and-answer punchboard was legal or not.

The city council refused to license it, as containing an element of chance. But circuit court ruled that people operating a board can not be arrested for failing to have a license when they tried to get it and were refused.

Boards can be outlawed under the state anti-lottery laws, but officials doubted that this one would be considered a lottery.

Valuable Painting In Rubbish

LOS ANGELES, (AP)—Poking through a rubbish heap paid off for Joseph Padore, a boiler-maker with artistic leanings.

He turned up a painting identified as a 250-year-old work by an Italian artist, Vincenzo Oleotti. Phil Bernay, Los Angeles art dealer engaged to restore the picture, said it is a copy of a masterpiece done in 1600 by Andrea Del Sarto, which now hangs in the Palazzo Pitti museum in Florence. It depicts the Holy Family.

Bernay estimated the painting to be worth at least \$2000 and theorized that it was discarded by a family unaware of its worth. The colors, he said, have retained their original richness and warmth. The finder, Padore, is a painter himself and has done a mural for his church.

1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
1 egg
1 cup coarsely crushed corn flakes
