Portland Gets Swan Island Back

PORTLAND, Nov. 18 (P) — Swan island, the one-time Portland airport which was turned into a huge shipyard during the war, is reverting to the city again.

The port of Portland agreed yesterday to take back the property from the federal government now, although the federal lease does not expire until 1952.

The agreement provides that the city will pay \$350,000 for buildings and equipment on the property, and that federal agencies housed there may remain until 1952.

Exactly what will be done with all the land is not certain. Aviation groups want at least a strip turned into an airport again. But other factions think it all should be industrial sites.

A few industries are already there, on lease, and will stay on. And the port of Portland intends to operate a drydock, leased from the navy, on one side of the island.

SAME RATE

PORTLAND, Nov. 18 (P) — Bonneville power administration will continue charging \$17.50 a kilowatt year to its present customers for the next five years. "In 1954," Paul J. Raver, Bonneville regional administrator, told the Bonneville Regional Advisory council, "we expect to have to increase the rate . . . but not more than \$5 a kilowatt year."

\$2500 Reward In Woman's Mystery Death

VANCOUVER, B. C., Nov. 18 (AP) — A \$2500 reward was posted yesterday for a solution to the death of Fernie Blanche Fisher, 48-year-old store clerk.

A coroner's jury returned an open verdict yesterday, that death had been caused by drowning after the bruises on her body had been inflicted by an unknown person.

Dr. T. R. Harmon, coroner's pathologist, said the middle-aged woman had been violated.

Miss Fisher's shaven body was found floating in False creek here November 9. One month and a day earlier, the body of another woman—Joyce Monasterick, 25, waitress—was found on a nearby beach. Police said they believed both women to have been murdered.

New 'Inventory' In Liquor Stores

An "inventory" system of sales recording is being installed in all state liquor stores in Oregon, including those in Klamath Falls, replacing the old sales slips filled out on liquor purchases.

Sales now are recorded on cards which are punched for business machine use. Instead of having to take a personal inventory of stocks on hand before making periodic orders of liquor, the store now using the card system feeds its cards into a machine which does the work.
