Sales Pressure Bogs Grains

CHICAGO, Nov. 23 (AP)—Efforts to extend the grain price advance ran into difficulties on the board of trade today. Selling pressure, some of it profit-taking, weighed down on the market.

Prices started out steady on buying tied in with export sales of wheat, corn and soybean oil. Once this demand was satisfied, however, the market started to slip.

Wheat closed 1/4-1/2 lower, December \$2.14-2.14 1/2, corn was 1/4-1/2 lower, December \$1.27-1.27 1/2, oats were 1/4 lower, December \$1.31-1.31 1/2, soybeans were unchanged to 1 cent higher, December \$2.26-2.26 1/2, and land was 1/2 to 1 cent a hundred pounds lower, December \$10.25.

Stocks Appear Broadening

NEW YORK, Nov. 23 (AP)—Demand for stocks showed signs of broadening late in today's market.

Fractional gains were well distributed and numerous issues which were down part of the day managed to creep into the plus column.

Turnover approached 1,500,000 shares for the full session.

Liquor and automobile stocks were prominent in the afternoon pickup in demand.

Studebaker dropped more than a point at one time following news of a \$1.25 year-end dividend. Part of the loss was later regained.

Union Pacific lost about a point on word that last year's extra of \$1 a share was not repeated.

Higher prices were paid for Schenley, National Distillers, General Motors, Chrysler, Republic Steel, International Hydro-Electric and American Smelting.
