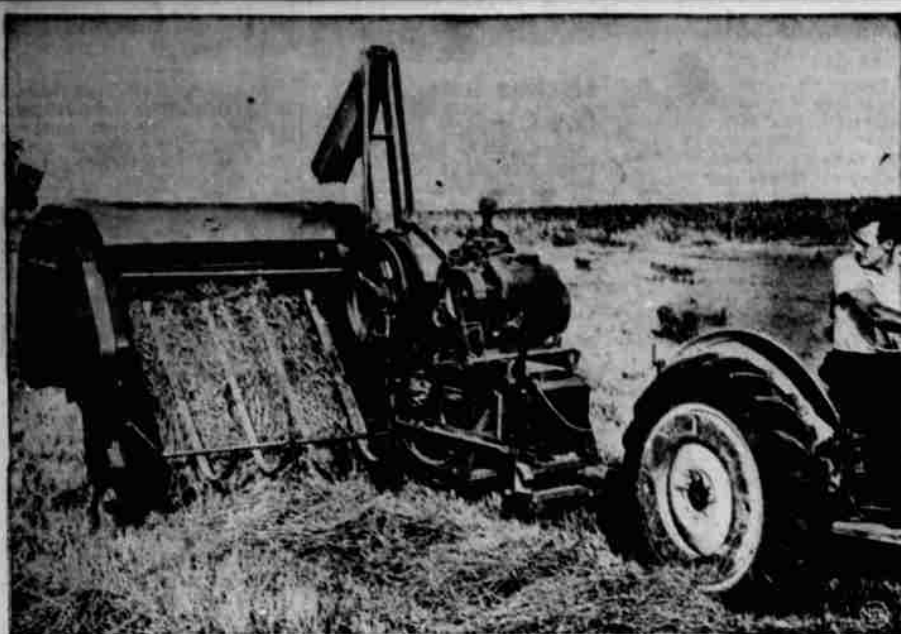

Baby Chick Prices To Hold Next Year

Baby chicks will sell at approximately the same levels during 1950 as they did this year if present hatching industry expectations are followed through.

Prospective chick prices were made public recently during the annual fall meeting of the Oregon hatchery association when the annual industry "intention" survey results were made known by Noel Bannion, OSC extension poultry specialist.

Asking prices for both Leghorn and heavy breed cockerels are set for one cent advance during 1950. Hatcherymen expect to receive 4 cents apiece for Leghorn; 14 cents for heavy breed day old, sexed cockerels.

Dip
Straight run Leghorn chicks are expected to stay at 1949 levels—18 cents. Meanwhile, a dip from 19 to 18 cents apiece is expected for straight run heavy breed chicks.

Bannion said the relationship between the pounds of feed a dozen eggs will buy—the egg-feed ratio—during the months of November, March, April, and May is closely tied in with the number of chicks hatched each year. He points out that the egg-feed ratio now is not as favorable as it was in early 1949. Thus, he anticipates some national reduction in chicks hatched.

Step-Up
Despite an anticipated downward trend in chick numbers, the poultry specialist said that Oregon hatcherymen expect to step-up their output next year. The reason is that Oregon now imports approximately 25 to 30 per cent of the market eggs and chicken meat consumed, and local producers are in a good competitive position to assume much of this market.

Low Cost Farm Unit Designed

A unique type of temporary farm home called the "Agency Plains Special" is the subject of a new seven page mimeograph, containing drawings, buildings instructions and a bill of materials, which has been released by the county extension offices.

The mimeograph, number HE 7-1110, may also be obtained by writing direct to Oregon State College. Its title is "Agency Plains Special."

Prepared by John C. Campbell, OSC extension rural housing specialist, the mimeograph describes in detail how to construct the combination machine shed and temporary living quarters. This type building, the author writes, is popular in newly irrigated sections of central Oregon because it reduces the farm family's investment in housing to a minimum while initial farm development is underway.

The name, "Agency Plains Special" results from the popularity of this type building in the section of the Decades project known as Agency Plains. The building is also suitable for a combination tenant house and machine shed.

Farm Food Dollar Declining This Year

The farmers' share of the consumer's food dollar has been declining steadily this year, according to the weekly farm price, crop and weather review, prepared by the OSC extension service from USDA reports and other data.

During the first month of the year, the farmer received 51 cents of every dollar spent, while 49 cents went for marketing charges. For the next two months the farmer's share and marketing charges were evenly divided, with 50 cents going each way.

In April and May, the farmer's share dropped 1 cent to 49 cents.

Price for Heifer Sets New High

A Hereford heifer from the Hoover Ranch near Medford sold for \$12 more than the highest price ever paid for a heifer in the same class at the Ogden, Utah, livestock show this week.

C. C. Hoover, ranch owner, reported the price was \$1000. The animal was fitted at the Nion Tucker Ploum Rock ranch near Prospect and exhibited by Cy Williams. Hoover said the Ogden event is one of the largest in the country.

Groups to Hold Columbia Talks

A series of dinner meetings dealing with Columbia basin resources and problems has been arranged by the Oregon State College Geographers association.

Information bearing on the pros and cons of a Columbia valley authority will be stressed at the meetings, announced Dr. J. Granville Jensen, head of the staff.

The meeting will be held the evenings of December 1, January 12, February 2 and March 2 in Corvallis with representatives of the interior department, army engineers and federal department of agriculture as speakers.

and in June a 7-year low was established at 48 cents. This 48-cent level has held through August, the latest month on which reports are available. This is 5 cents lower than the August 1948 share of 53 cents.

Retail prices of goods and services bought by moderate-income city families increased slightly from mid-August to mid-September but was still about 3 per cent below a year earlier.

The government wholesale price index which also recorded an increase from August to September, fluctuated mildly during October. On November 1, however, this index was slightly below a month earlier, and was down about 7 per cent for the year.

Farm products at wholesale continued to decline throughout October to a level nearly 14 per cent below a year earlier. Foods were down 8 1/2 per cent for the year. All commodities, other than farm products and foods, were down more than 5 1/2 per cent compared with the first of November, 1948.

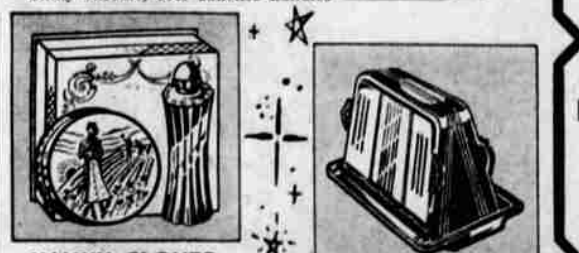
