

Congress Seen Turning Thumbs Down on Bid To Extend Draft Law

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—An emphatic "No" is expected to be congress' answer to any request for extension of the draft law next year.

Congressional leaders believe the administration will make such a request, probably early in 1950, and are confident congress will turn it down.

They have in effect so notified President Truman and Secretary of Defense Johnson.

In a letter to the president and Johnson discussing medical benefits for servicemen's dependents, Chairman Vinson (D-Ga.) of the house armed services committee and Rep. Kilday (D-Tex.) of the same committee said "It is exceedingly unlikely that the extension will be approved."
