

CADETS, MIDDIES IN 50TH MEETING

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 25 (AP)—Army, boasting an undefeated string of 19 straight, and an erratic Navy eleven met on the gridiron for the 50th time tomorrow in a game for which past performances can be tossed down the hatch.

Karl Blaik's Black Knights from West Point haven't bowed since Notre Dame's 27-7 romp in 1947.

They are favored to keep that record intact in Philadelphia's huge municipal stadium where President Harry S. Truman and some 102,000 other football fans will be on hand for the 10:30 a.m. (PST) kickoff.

But backers of the Middles delight in recalling that the Cadets were even stronger favorites in 1946 when Glen Davis and Doc Blanchard led the West Point forces and again last fall when Navy had not won a game.

CLOSE The Blanchard-Davis team won 21-16 but the Navy was knocking at the victory door when time ran out. Then a year ago, the Middles battled the West Pointers to a 21-21 deadlock. That tie and a 7-7 stalemate with Pennsylvania in 1947 are the only black spots on Army's string of triumphs.

For those who like to compare figures here's a few that establish the Army as the outstanding choice. The Cadets have rolled up 316 points and held the opposition to 69 in taking eight games this fall. The Middles, winning three, losing four and tying one, have been outscored 200 to 151.

COMMON FOES Take a glance at common foes. Army beat Columbia 63-6. Navy downed the Lions 34-0. Army just squeezed through a 14-13 victory over Pennsylvania while Navy bowed to the Red and Blue 28-7. Both of the teams arrived on the scene of the battle today and took up headquarters at nearby country clubs. The regiment of midshipmen, numbering 3400, will lead the parade into the stadium at noon tomorrow. The 2445 men of the corps of cadets will follow.

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Ted Williams Gets 'Most Valuable' Nod

NEW YORK, Nov. 25 (AP)—The Boston Red Sox may have failed to win the American league pennant but they possess the circuit's most valuable player in Ted Williams.

The brilliant batting star, whose team lost the flag to the New York Yankees on the final day of the season, gained some measure of revenge when he defeated the World Champions' Phil Rizzuto and Joe Page for the coveted prize.

Williams' selection by a committee of 24 members of the Baseball Writers' association, three from each city, was doubly significant since it marked the first time in six years that such an honor was bestowed upon a member of a non-pennant winning club.

Detroit's Hal Newhouser, back in 1944, was the last player to accomplish it. Only two others, Charley Gehringer and Jimmy Fox, achieved that feat since the writers' took over the voting in 1931.

It was the second time that Williams has won. The tall, slender flycatcher also won in 1946 and finished second in '42 and '47, losing by one vote to Joe DiMaggio in the latter year. Lou Boudreau, Cleveland's playing manager, won last year.

Williams, the 31-year-old native of San Diego, paced the league in

home runs, runs batted in, runs scored, doubles and total bases, but lost the unofficial batting title to Detroit's George Kell on the final day. He was named on all 24 ballots.

He received 13 firsts, three seconds, seven thirds and one fourth to total 272 points, 98 more than Rizzuto. The Yankees' dazzling shortstop, obtained five firsts among his 178 points to beat out his teammate, Joe Page, for runner up honors. The peerless relief pitcher had 164 points.

On a point basis—with 14 for first, nine for second and so on to one for tenth—Mel Parnell, Red Sox south-paw pitcher finished fourth with 151 points. Ellis Kinder, his right-handed pitching mate, was fifth with 112, one more than New York's Tommy Henrich. Junior Stephens, Boston's hard-hitting shortstop, ranked seventh with an even 100 points.

Rounding out the top ten were Detroit's George Kell, Cleveland's Bob Lemon and Vic Wertz, Tiger outfielder.
