Many Seeking Land Grants; Info Supplied

From 12 to 20 requests concerning land openings are received each week according to C. H. Ault, agriculturist at the bureau of reclamation office.

"Our requests come from all over the country," Ault said, "but the majority of them are from people in Western states."

Reclamation officials here state that no new land openings or developments in the California-Oregon area are expected for several years.

Instructions—A form letter and a pamphlet of future land developments of the reclamation bureau are mailed to each application. The information contains regional offices and addresses of each development project.

"Future homestead developments anywhere in the country will be widely publicized," Ault said. "Major newspapers and radio stations will receive information well in advance of any openings."

2 Customers Die Fighting Pub Gunman

LEWISTON, Idaho, Nov. 25 (AP)—Two barroom customers were shot to death early today as they wrestled with a masked gunman intent on robbery.

A police dragnet was spread around the city immediately in an effort to catch the killer.

Victims—The victims were Charles Lemmons, 70, and John Hendley, 32, both of Lewiston.

Lemmons was the first to die. As the masked gunman walked into the Main street bar at midnight and waved a pistol at the bartender, Gladys Keller, Lemmons stepped from his booth.

"You can't do that to her," he shouted. A single bullet caught him in the stomach, but he moved forward and grappled with the gunman briefly before collapsing and dying.



Second Death—Hendley went to Lemmons' aid but also was shot, in the chest, and collapsed.

The gunman then fled, firing four more shots as he ran.
