

# New 'Drunkometer' Seen As Swift, Sure Judge Of Drunkenness Decree

NEW YORK, Nov. 29 (AP)—Science is working both sides of the street. Not only does it develop drinks that are more tempting, but it also comes up with better devices to blast your alibi if you have too many.

Among the displays at the chemical industries exposition here is a streamlined 1950 model "alcometer," which might more aptly be called a "drunkometer."

It's about the size of a small console radio and the manufacturers say it's as easy to operate. It has a sloping panel with about half a dozen controls, a large dial with a pointer and a tube sticking out the right hand side.

**B-Minnie Verdict**

You blow your breath into the tube. The operator of the machine, a refinement of earlier models, manipulates the controls. Eight minutes later the hand on the dial moves over the telltale evidence—cold sober, mildly intoxicated, or stinko.

The machine, made by Alfred Bicknell Associates of Cambridge, Mass., was developed by Dr. Leon A. Greenberg and associates in the

department of applied physiology at Yale university.

Dr. Greenberg explained that the dial is calibrated to show the percentage of alcohol in the blood. This has been accepted in a number of states as legal evidence of degree of intoxication. The machine actually measures the amount of alcohol on the breath, but translates this to percentage in the blood because the two are related by a fixed ratio.

Dr. Greenberg said the universally accepted measurements are these: Up to .05 per cent alcohol in your blood, sober; .05 to .15 per cent, your command of your faculties probably is impaired but that alone is not proof you're drunk; from .15 up, no questions about it—you're plastered.

That .05 to .15 range, he explained, is the range covering the difference in individuals which cause one person to be cutting capers on two martinis and another to be steady as a rock even after four or five. But he said beyond .15, it can be safely concluded a person is drunk no matter how well he can hold his liquor.

One advantage of the machine, he declared, is that it is much faster and simpler than taking a blood sample and making an analysis. The gadget also is portable, so it can be taken to practically any location and plugged into the nearest light socket.

**Good and Bad**

Dr. Greenberg and the manufacturers both emphasize that the machine not only gets the goods on the guilty, but protects the innocent. If you really did have "only a couple of beers," the machine will back you up. And it also protects persons suffering from shock, diabetic coma or other conditions which might cause them to be erroneously charged with being intoxicated.

# Six Youths Sought In Mass Assault

CHEHALIS, Wash., Nov. 29 (AP)—Six youths, now being sought for the mass rape of a 22-year-old woman, may also be charged with kidnaping and attempted murder, Prosecutor Durwin Cunningham said today.

The attack was reported by Mrs. Josephine Huss, 22, of nearby Centralia. Sheriff Frank Thayer said six "John Doe" warrants charging rape were issued yesterday.

Mrs. Huss said that after the attack, one of her assailants wanted to beat her over the head with a rock. He was discouraged by his companions, however, and finally agreed she should be thrown into the flooding Cowlitz river after she told them she could not swim. She was nude.

She saved herself by grabbing a rock and pulling herself to the bank. Thayer said all nearby military stations are being checked on the strength of Mrs. Huss' story that her attackers mentioned they "had to get back to base." All, however, were civilian clothes.

The young woman told Cunningham she was pulled into a car a little outside nearby Toledo about 2:30 a. m. Sunday by two of her attackers. She was taken to a gravel pit where several of the men attacked her.

# Texas Woman Killed By Auto Blast

DALLAS, Tex., Nov. 29 (AP)—Mrs. Mildred Noble, wife of a widely known Dallas gambler, was killed today when an automobile she started blew up.

Dallas police said there apparently were explosives in the car.

The explosion occurred in Oak Cliff, a Dallas residential district, at 8:15 a. m.

Mrs. Noble was the wife of Herbert Noble, 40, who was wounded in a running gun battle with unidentified men September 9. On two previous occasions Noble was wounded in gun fights.
