



### Yule Mailing Rules Presented

Christmas mailing rules and advice for packages and greeting cards were explained this week by Postmaster Burt E. Hawkins.

To facilitate the handling of Christmas mail, the post office asks your cooperation:

1. Purchase extra stamps early to avoid last minute waiting in line. Remember that stamps for Christmas cards are better sent first class; also the rate for unsealed cards is now 2 cents instead of the former 1 1/2 cents.
2. For packages, wrap in heavy cardboard, sturdy wrapping paper and tie with strong cord. Also use fourth class labels for parcel post.
3. Address all packages with complete and full names and addresses. Also repeat the address inside the outer wrappings in case they are damaged in transit.

#### Cheese-Tuna Dunk

1 pint cream-style cottage cheese  
 1/2 cup mayonnaise  
 1 tea. garlic powder  
 Salt to taste

If you want to give sterling to a bride-to-be, or to your Best Girl, there is a love of a sterling bon bon dish at \$3.25 and sterling napkin rings are nice to keep forever. The ones we saw were strictly plain at \$2 and \$3 and would be lovely engraved. Salt and peppers were nice and sturdy at \$3.95.

One of the prettiest of the nicer gifts we saw was an individual jam or mustard jar in a combination of crystal and sterling at \$3.95.

A wonderful bowl, perfectly plain, for nuts or jelly at \$10 and you couldn't go wrong.

A six-inch tile, crystal with silver overlay at \$8.75, and an eight-inch footed tile at \$18 was in the upper bracket of nice gifts.
