LONDON, Nov. 30 (AP)—Britain plans to clamp down hard next year on phony guides who make up their English history as they go along.

By cleaning up the guide business—especially in history-crammed old London—the government-sponsored travel association also hopes to protect gullible American tourists from seedy little men who conceivably might try to sell them Nelson's column or some horses of the household cavalry.

The association will launch its campaign for better and more accurate guides January 1 when it sets up a voluntary central register of qualified guides.
