BUTTERSCOTCH CANDY CAKE Quick-method recipe
Mix together into a large bowl:
2 1/4 cups sifted cake flour
2 1/2 teaspoons double-action baking powder (3/4 teaspoon single-action)
1/4 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar
Add:

1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
1/2 cup strong coffee
