

Jury Hears Recorded Confession

ROSEBURG, Dec. 1 (AP)—By means of a wire recording, a jury yesterday heard Joseph Louis Kiel, Myrtle Creek, tell in his own words how he allegedly killed Stanley James Tucker, Springfield, by strangling him with a belt.

"Something new" in trial work in Oregon, the recording was admitted in evidence over the objection of the defense. Circuit Judge William G. East ruled that the statement was voluntarily given, after he had listened to the recording after the jury was dismissed Tuesday afternoon.

"Now tell us just exactly first how you killed him?" the jurors heard the voice of District Attorney Robert G. Davis ask.

"Well, I took my belt off and choked him with it," the voice of Kiel came over the machine.

Under questioning of the district attorney, Kiel told details leading up to the alleged crime and disposition of Tucker's body under a bridge near Biddle's October 30. The recording was made after Kiel's arrest the night of October 30.

Mrs. Bishop's Funeral Held Monday

Funeral services for the late Mrs. Nettie Josephine Bishop were held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Fort Klamath Methodist church, with Rev. Wesley Huntley, pastor of Chiloquin and Fort Klamath churches, officiating. Mrs. Bishop, who was a beloved long-time Wood River valley resident, passed away at Klamath Falls on Tuesday, November 22, following an extended illness.

She was born November 17, 1883, at Pittsfield, Mass., being 66 years old at the time of her death. Up until the time she was stricken by illness, she was an active member of many years' standing of the Civic Improvement club, women's organization of Fort Klamath.

Widowed

She was preceded in death several years ago by her husband, Fred Bishop. During their years of residence here, Mr. and Mrs. Bishop were engaged in dairying, first at the Pelton ranch later moving to the old Kirkpatrick place west of here, and of more recent years, had leased the Alvin Copeland property in Fort Klamath. Since the death of her husband, Mrs. Bishop had been living at her home here. In addition to relatives in the East, she is survived by a son, Leon, who with his wife and daughter, Suzanne, arrived here last week, called by the death of his mother. They returned this week to their home at Prosser, Wash.

Funeral rites for Mrs. Bishop were attended by local friends and neighbors, with several old friends also coming from outside points to pay their last respects to the deceased. Two selections were sung by Beth Moore, soprano soloist of Klamath Falls, including "Saviour Like a Shepherd Lead Us," and "When Shall I Behold His Presence?"

Funeral services were held at 2 o'clock at the church, with Rev. Wesley Huntley officiating. Burial was in the cemetery.

Commitment services were held by Rev. Huntley at the graveside at the Fort Klamath cemetery, where Mrs. Bishop was laid to rest in the family plot.
