Small Car Price Cuts In 1950 Seen Because Of New Transmissions

DETROIT, Dec. 5 (AP)—Some 1950 model automobiles are going to cost a little less than the current models.

The lower price will result from the reductions being made for new automatic transmissions. The cuts aren't very great—from \$25 to \$40—but many industry observers see in them evidence of a trend toward lower car prices.

So far automatic transmissions have been confined to cars in the middle and higher price fields. In the last year or two they have become increasingly popular. The demand for them has grown so steadily that Chevrolet and Ford will have them next year.

Chevrolet will announce its device soon after January 1 with presentation of its 1950 models. Ford has disclosed its transmission, developed in cooperation with Borg-Warner, will be ready next summer.

Popular

With but one or two exceptions all makes of cars above the low price group now have some form of automatic transmission. In some instances they have been made standard equipment, with corresponding price adjustments.

When they are optional at extra cost public demand has been so great that relatively few cars have been turned out without them. So the transmission price cuts currently being made amount, in effect, to a reduction in the price of the cars affected.

That's the view of many industry observers. They add that had the \$25 to \$40 transmission price cuts been announced merely as reductions in car prices they probably would have gained much wider car buyer interest.

GM Cuts

In all instances the reductions so far announced affect General Motors transmissions—Buick's Dynaflo and the Hydra-matic used by

and Ford transmissions probably will not be low priced units. Ford has said the price will be "under \$150." Chevrolet has made no price comment, but most guesses are that it will not be much under the same figure.

Industry quarters have heard a higher powered engine will go into Chevrolets equipped with the automatic transmission. This, too, has not been confirmed at the company offices.
